

DVD's are available to rent for a cost of \$2.00. Take them home and view at your leisure. We do have some new DVD's available.


The Fulfillment of All Desire Ralph Martin

THE BEST HOUR

Adoration became my refuge during a major test of faith

I scarcely realized it at the time, but it was no coincidence that as I fell in love with my husband, he helped me to fall in love with Christ in the Eucharist. It started when I, a faithful Lutheran, began dating Ryan, a Catholic who loved going to adoration. He had received a piece of advice from a friend who told him, “just get her to adoration, and the Lord will do the rest.”

Following the advice, Ryan invited me every week to pray with him in front of the Blessed Sacrament. The whole idea of adoration was hard for me to grasp, but the thought of an hour of peace and quiet away from the world certainly appealed to me. So, I decided to join him, and slowly, it began to change me. I saw people bowing, kneeling and sometimes even prostrating themselves in front of the monstrance. I saw them pouring out their hearts and being filled up with Jesus’ healing and love. I wanted what they had.

As Ryan and I grew in love, we kept going to adoration, and my searching heart began to grasp that Jesus really was present in the HOST. Shortly before Ryan and I got married in 2002 and after much prayer, I joined the Catholic Church. Adoration had become the best hour of each week and something I would long for after our lives got busier with children. Little did I realize that it would sustain in the future, even when Ryan could not.

In 2007, Ryan began to complain about short intense headaches and memory loss so he drove himself to the emergency room. Within a day the doctors told us Ryan had a cancerous brain tumor and needed immediate surgery.

For the next two years we tried to hold the cancer at bay. Ryan had another surgery and it appeared successful. All the while Ryan kept going to his weekly adoration hour. We welcomed our third child in 2009, but as the year went on, Ryan’s condition worsened. In January 2010 he decided to stop the treatment he had been receiving. He sensed that the end was near and he wanted to be near his family. Ryan died on Holy Thursday, the day we celebrate the Eucharist feast at the Last Supper.

This timing held deep significance for me, although my heart was broken.

I was now left to take care of three children under the age of six. I felt that I was face down on the floor with no way to get up. I remained strong to help my husband on his journey to heaven. Now who would be there to help me? No one could feel the pain I was experiencing. No one could revive my spirit. No one could help except JESUS.

There were many times when I prayed for God’s healing touch in that chapel, but one hour in particular arrived in a way that was more personal and profound than I ever could have imagined.

It was a couple of years after Ryan’s death. I was sitting in the Lord’s presence prayerfully doing homework for a Bible study group. I came across a question asking me to let God plant a favourite picture of Jesus in my mind. So I sat for a few moments and stared at Jesus in the Host. Then I closed my eyes and there it was.

The scene was so clear and so real that tears rolled down my face. Ryan lay in his hospital bed as he took his final breath, holding his rosary. I sat beside him. My hands were grasping his and my head lay on his chest. We had just sung the “Amen” to the Litany of the Saints. On the other side of his bed, I saw Jesus sitting in another chair. He was wearing a dazzling white robe and his hands were on ours. He looked at us with a loving gaze in his eyes and then bowed his head. At that precise moment I felt his touch.

God loved me enough to show me that He was present when I needed Him the most. I will always treasure this experience. Time is in God’s hands. I continually place every day in His hands. My weekly adoration hour has become an anchor in this process. I adore Christ who is real. I adore Christ who is living. I adore Christ whose love never ends. Worshiping Him and spending time with Him in the adoration chapel is one of the best decisions I have ever made.

THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

The first day of school our professor introduces himself and challenges us to get to know someone we didn't already know. I stood up to look around when a gentle hand touched my shoulder.

I turned around to find a wrinkled, little old lady beaming up at me with a smile that lit up her entire being. She said, "Hi handsome, my name is Rose. I'm eighty-seven years old. Can I give you a hug?"

I laughed and enthusiastically responded, "Of course you may!" and she gave me a giant squeeze.

"Why are you in college at such a young, innocent age?" I asked. She jokingly replied, "I'm here to meet a rich husband, get married and have a couple of kids." No seriously, I asked. I was curious what may have motivated her to be taking on this challenge at her age. "I have always dreamed of having a college education and now I'm getting one," she told me.

After class we walked to the student union building and shared a chocolate milkshake. We became instant friends. Every day for the next three months we would leave class together and talk nonstop. I was always mesmerized listening to this time machine as she shared her wisdom and experience with me.

Over the course of the year, Rose became a campus icon and she easily made friends wherever she went. She loved to dress up and she revelled in the attention bestowed upon her from the other students. She was living it up.

At the end of the semester we invited Rose to speak at our football banquet. I'll never forget what she taught us. She was introduced and stepped up to the podium. As she began to deliver her prepared speech, she dropped her three by five cards on the floor.

Frustrated and a little embarrassed she leaned into the microphone and simply said, "I'm sorry I'm so jittery. I gave up beer for Lent and this whiskey is killing me! I'll never get my speech back in order so let me just tell you what I know.

As we laughed she cleared her throat and began. "We do not stop playing because we are old; we grow old because we stop playing. There are only four secrets to staying young, being happy and achieving success. You have to laugh and find humour every day. You've got to have a dream. When you lose your dreams, you die. We have so many people walking around who are dead and don't even know it.

There is a huge difference between growing older and growing up. If you are nineteen years old and lie in bed for one full year and don't do one productive thing, you will turn twenty years old. If I am eighty-seven years old and stay in bed for a year and never do anything I will turn eighty-eight.

Anybody can grow older. That doesn't take any talent or ability. The idea is to grow up by always finding opportunity in change. Have no regrets. The elderly usually don't have regrets for what we did, but rather for things we did not do. The only people who fear death are those with regrets. She concluded her speech by courageously singing "The Rose."

She challenged each of us to study the lyrics and live them out in our daily lives. At the year's end Rose finished the college degree she had begun all those months ago.

One week after graduation Rose died peacefully in her sleep. Over two thousand college students attended her funeral in tribute to the wonderful woman who taught by example that it's never too late to be all you can possibly be.

REMEMBER, GROWING OLDER IS MANDATORY, GROWING UP IS OPTIONAL.

We make a living by what we get. We make a life by what we give. God promises a safe landing, not a calm passage. If God brings you to it, He will bring you through it.

Five Prayers Taught at Fatima by Mary & the Angels

On May 13, 1917, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal with an urgent message for the whole world. Between May and October she would appear five more times, each on the 13th of the month.

She identified herself as Our Lady of the Rosary and urged the children to [pray the rosary daily](#) for peace in the world (as World War I raged on) and to make sacrifices for the conversion of sinners. Over the course of these visits and several preceding visits by an angel, there were five prayers that were taught to Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta.

THE PARDON PRAYER

The angel who appeared to the children called himself the Angel of Peace and the Angel of Portugal. He taught them the following prayer:

My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love Thee! I ask pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love Thee.

THE ANGEL'S PRAYER

On one occasion, the three children saw the angel prostrate before a host and chalice that hung in the air. Worshiping the Eucharist, the angel prayed,

Most Holy Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – I adore Thee profoundly. I offer Thee the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges and indifferences whereby He is offended. And through the infinite merits of His Most Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg of Thee the conversion of poor sinners.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

During the first apparition of Our Lady of Fatima, the children found themselves “moved by an interior impulse,” as Lucia later explained, to say the following prayer together:

Most Holy Trinity, I adore Thee! My God, my God, I love Thee in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

THE SACRIFICE PRAYER

The Blessed Mother taught the children to offer all their personal sacrifices to God by praying, ***Oh my Jesus, I offer this for love of Thee, for the conversion of sinners and in reparation for the sins committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary.***

THE ROSARY DECADE PRAYER

The Blessed Mother stressed the critical importance of praying the rosary daily for the conversion of sinners and for peace in the world.

She asked that the following prayer be recited at the end of each rosary decade:

Oh My Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of Hell, lead all souls to Heaven, especially those in most need of Thy mercy.



AN INCREDIBLE WAY TO LOOK AT GOD

When God solves our problems, we have faith in HIS abilities. When God doesn't solve our problems HE has faith in our abilities. God's accuracy may be observed in the following ways:

As an example observed in the hatching of eggs; those of the canary in 14 days; those of the barnyard hen in 21 days; eggs of ducks and geese in 28 days; those of the mallard in 35 days. The eggs of the parrot and the ostrich hatch in 42 days. Notice, they are all divisible by seven, the number of days in a week.

God's wisdom is seen in the making of an elephant. The four legs of this great beast all bend forward in the same direction. No other quadruped is so made. God planned that this animal would have a huge body too large to live on two legs. For this reason He gave it four fulcrums so that it can rise from the ground easily. The horse rises from the ground on its two front legs first. A cow rises from the ground with its two hind legs first. How wise the Lord is in all His works of creation!

Each watermelon has an even number of stripes on the rind. Each orange has an even number of segments. Each ear of corn has an even number of rows. Each stalk of wheat has an even number of grains. Every bunch of bananas has on its lowest row an even number of bananas, and each row decreases by one, so that one row has an even number and the next row an odd number.


Isn't it amazing. The waves of the sea rollin on shore twenty-six to the minute in all kinds of weather. All grains are found in even numbers on the stalks.

Let us tell you a little about this book. The book covers plenty of material on Catholicism – from doctrine to morality and from worship and liturgy to devotions – but you don't need a degree in theology to comprehend it. Everything is presented in an informal, easy-to-understand way.

Although Catholicism For Dummies, 3rd Edition is no substitute for the official Catechism of the Catholic Church, our hope is that it will wet your whistle. It doesn't cover everything about Catholicism, but it does present the basic stuff so that the next time you're invited to a Catholic wedding, baptism, first communion, confirmation or funeral, you won't be totally confused. And you may have an edge on other people in your life who are less informed about Catholicism than you.

Whether you're Catholic or not, you may be totally clueless about or just unaware of some aspects of Catholic tradition, history, doctrine, worship, devotion or culture. No Sweat! Regardless of whether you're engaged, married or related to a Catholic; your neighbour or co-worker is a Catholic; or,

you're just curious about what Catholics really do believe, then, this book is for you!

This book is also a reference, unlike the school books you had as a kid. You don't have to read the chapters in order. You can just pick the topic that interests you, or find the page that addresses the specific question you have. Another method is to just open the book and randomly pick a place to start reading.
