
God awaits you here on the top of His mountain each and every week that you may have "life abundantly".

In May 2017, the little servants of Christ the King prayer community celebrated our forty-fifth anniversary. Who are we? We are a group of committed Catholics from across the Sudbury region, who surrenders fully to Jesus Christ as our Lord and Saviour. We know the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Catholic faith and we actively promote Exposition and Adoration. We honor Mary, the Mother of Jesus and have placed our prayer Community under her protection as Mother of Perpetual Help. We are loyal to our local Bishop and to the Magisterium of the Church. We give God permission to use us as He wants, and continually seek His Will and follow it to the best of our ability. We spend time both in private, personal daily prayer and in group prayer spontaneously praying together in praise and thanksgiving. We are a community who recognizes each person's uniqueness and giftedness, sharing experiences, trials and joys. We reach out to the wider community in active service to God's people.

In May of 1972, a group of people began to meet regularly for shared prayer, firstly in a private home, then in the library at the Sudbury General Hospital. It was not long after that this small group began to meet weekly in the basement hall at Christ the King Church. Thus began the prayer community of Christ the King. It was God's choice to visit us with a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit and His Gifts. In spite of our own personal shortcomings, the Lord used us to usher forth a move of His Spirit through the Charismatic Renewal in the Catholic Church in this region. Many people who reflect on this renewal see it as a providential answer to Pope John XXIII's prayer at the beginning of the second Vatican Council for a new Pentecost. "Renew Your wonders in this our day, as by a new Pentecost. Grant to Your Church that being of one mind, and steadfast in prayer with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and following the lead of blessed Peter, it may advance the reign of Our Divine Saviour, the reign of truth and justice, the reign of love and peace. Amen." (prayer of Pope John XXIII to the Holy Spirit from the Documents of Vatican 11, 1996, pp709 and 793)

We have been blessed with gifted spiritual directors who have built the prayer group on a strong foundation of prayer, both personal and communal; the Sacraments; the Lord's Word and the teachings of the Magisterium of the Church. In June 1981, Msgr. Raymond Farrell came to Sudbury as pastor of Christ the King Parish then was moved to Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church. Under the direction of Bishop Plouffe the prayer community moved to Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church (later named Our Lady of Hope), as our spiritual home. After much prayer and reflection, the Perpetual Adoration Chapel opened twenty-four hours a day seven days a week, and remains to this day as a powerful place of worship where hundreds of people each week come into the Presence of Our Lord for His peace, joy and love. The thanksgiving box is full of notes of thanksgiving each month for prayer requests answered. Since its inception, the prayer community has administered this special chapel, and on November 1, 2017, we will be celebrating twenty-seven years of continual adoration of the Lord in the Perpetual Adoration chapel. It is truly holy ground, and a remarkable witness to the people of the Sudbury area.

Following are some of our activities over these past forty-five years. We have facilitated The Life in the Spirit Seminars and the Growth in The Spirit Seminars over ninety times. These courses are used as the foundation for developing a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. Many thousands have taken these seminars, which are very, very powerful. We have been blessed with wonderful guest speakers who have preached numerous weekend retreats, seminars, days of reflection and special teaching courses. The highlight of our many guest speakers was Cardinal Sean O'Malley of Boston, who accepted our invitation to join us on October 14<sup>th</sup>, 2009 honoring our priests during the Year for Priests. It was a joyous and wonderful celebration!

Cardinal O’Malley was celebrant and homilist for the Mass and keynote speaker at the banquet, which followed. Over eighty-five priests and five hundred and fifty people from across our diocese were present for this wonderful celebration, who gathered to pray, to reflect, to thank and to honour our priests of the Diocese of Sault Ste. Marie. Other guest speakers have come from as far away as India and nearly every state in the United States as well as many provinces in Canada.

Over these years, we have sponsored a Lenten Mission each Saturday morning for five weeks during Lent. Twice a year, a special Mass for all those living with cancer and other terminal illnesses, their caregivers and family members is celebrated. Bishop Jean Louis Plouffe, and now our new Bishop Marcel Damphousse is the main celebrant and homilist for this event. During November of 2016’s Year of Mercy, a twenty-four hour “I Am Mercy” Retreat was celebrated led by Bishop Marcel and four priests of the Diocese. On October 13-14<sup>th</sup> of this year, another twenty-four hour retreat honouring Mary, Our Blessed Mother is being planned.

Each week before the prayer meeting begins, a DVD teaching series is shown on the large screen at Our Lady of Hope Church. All are invited to view these award-winning teaching series, which help us grow in our faith. Everyone is most welcome to attend and participate in all our activities.

Father Patrick O’Kenyi, sma, has been our Spiritual Director for the past five years since Msgr. Farrell’s illness and ultimate death.

Our prayer meetings are held each Thursday evening year round, for prayer, praise and song honoring God our Father, Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ under the inspiration of The Holy Spirit. The evening begins with praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, then the Rosary, a period of song and praise, followed by the Celebration of the Eucharist. At the conclusion of Mass, all who wish may be prayed with for their individual intentions.

The Sacrament of the Sick is administered on the last Thursday of every month by the priests of the prayer community. Many, many hundreds of people have been involved with the prayer community over the years, and many have remained to serve those the Lord sends to us. Within the prayer community, we have many active ministries doing God’s work. We are blessed with several gifted teachers and speakers who willingly give their time and expertise to serving God’s people. It is because of their commitment and dedicated service to the Lord and His people that we continue to be the ‘beacon on the hill’ that He is calling us to be.

For all who read this, we pray that you will invite the Lord Jesus to enter into your heart in a special way, to renew you and strengthen you, that you will grow deeply in love with Him, so that you will seek and follow the Will of God our Father.

Evangelization is the main goal of the little servants of Christ the King prayer community. Our Pope Francis summed up the three objectives of evangelization to which we are committed: firstly – to proclaim the Gospel to all people; secondly – to help bring about recommitment to those who already received the gospel but live it only nominally; and thirdly – to deepen the gospel in the lives of believers, so that we all can “Hand on The Faith” to coming generations. Praise be to God!

The Lord also told us that this is the time to prepare for what is coming, and surely it is coming, "this is the time of preparation."



This ministry began in January of 1995. When people are prayed with at our Thursday night prayer meetings and they 'rest in The Spirit', the people of the Compassion Ministry pray for them while they are 'resting'. They do not 'touch' unless needed to do so.

A person is invited into this ministry after they have made the 'Life in the Spirit' seminars and follow up with the 'Growth in the Spirit' seminars when it becomes available. This group meets five or six times a year, separate from the prayer

group meeting. The head of this ministry along with eight minor heads meet beforehand to see what the Lord wants in regards to preparation, teaching and training. All members of this ministry are invited to attend a half-day of prayer, praise and specialized learning. The group is made up of 'kneelers' and 'catchers'. The 'kneelers' pray near the people who are 'resting in the Spirit' and the 'catchers' are the ones who do what the word means – gently catch those who begin to rest in the Spirit.

They also provide compassionate care and concern for those who are ill or those who are recently bereaved by their presence at the funeral home and the funeral Mass.

## **THE BISHOP PLOUFFE CHAPEL OF PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION**



I would like to share with you the history of the Chapel of Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration. The Chapel came about with the help of many people in the early 1990's. Two members of the little servants of Christ the King prayer community, Mrs. Annette Ladouceur and Sister Marie Lariviere approached Father Raymond Farrell about starting perpetual adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, (Our Lady of Hope Church). After much prayer by the members of the service group, it was discerned that the Lord wanted this to happen. Father Farrell then spoke to Bishop Plouffe about this proposal, and Bishop Plouffe gave his consent. He then approached the Parish Council who also agreed and stated that when the church was first designed, Father Brennan had envisioned a chapel in that very spot which was included in the original plans.

Due to the fact that the chapel was open seven days a week and twenty-four hours a day, Mr. Larry Arsenault and the chapel team of 7 dedicated captains (one from each city area) worked to ensure that all 168 hours per week were covered. After some time Mrs. Marie Cook and the chapel coordinating team took over scheduling chapel hours. Later on it was handed over to Inez Germain, a member of Our Lady of Hope Parish and a long time member of the prayer community. My name is Linda Giusto and in May 2014 I answered the Lord's call and

followed in their footsteps to continue in this Ministry. I am a member of the prayer community and also a member of Our Lady of Hope Parish.

On November 1, 2015 Bishop Plouffe celebrated Mass of Thanksgiving for 25 years of Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration. The chapel was then dedicated and became known as the Bishop Plouffe's Perpetual Eucharistic Chapel.

We are so blessed to have this Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration Chapel in our Diocese.

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**May 25**



## FROM THE DESK OF THE SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

### SOME THINGS ARE TOO ATTRACTIVE TO BE TURNED DOWN

Some things are certainly too good to be turned down. This is especially true when it's a preference or choice like a delicacy or favourite dessert. I always find it hard to say no to "Goat pepper-soup", cheese cake, lemon pie or blueberry pie: These, unquestionably are too good for me to turn down.

As we prepare to celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, I have this to tell you: **The Holy Spirit is a Gift that is too attractive to be turned down.** On the day of Pentecost, the disciples didn't have time to say "NO" to the descent of the Holy Spirit on them. He descended on them like a "Special" or "Timely" meal that meets us at the very climax of our hunger or starvation. He came on them like a "delicacy" or the "dessert" that appears on the Eating table: **Too Attractive to Be Turned Down!**

Don't forget that the disciples were always meeting in hiding. They met in Upper-rooms, basements and homes. They were really hungry for the "Open". They were starving for courage and power. **Thank God, some things are too attractive to be turned down!**

No business venture, investment or event has yielded fruits or dividends like the Holy Spirit. On the day of Pentecost, about three thousand were added to the numbers of the disciples. And today, we have more than 2 billion baptised Christians in the world.

When the disciples received the Holy Spirit, they received Courage and Power:

- The Courage and Power to **Stand-Out**
- The Courage and Power to **Face Oppositions**
- The Courage and Power to **Witness**
- The Courage and Power to **Perform Miracles**
- The Courage and Power to **Love**
- The Courage and Power to **Lead**
- The Courage and Power to **Live**

In our contemporary world where all the rulers and rules are working against our faith we undoubtedly need this courage and power; we need a new Pentecost. We need a new baptism of the Spirit. ## Our journey to Canada and in Canada – a summary of 5 years

When Tibor had lost his job in Hungary, we had no idea what kind of journey had started. After a year of searching for a job there, an offer came from his former company that opened the door to work either in Australia, New Zealand or in Canada. Canada was the closest among the options, so we chose that one. The offer contained 2 options: Mississauga or Sudbury. Everybody looked shocked when we opted for Sudbury, even the interviewers for his job from here expressed their doubts about this choice. However, after some bureaucratic hoops and two delayed flights – because the visa had not been processed in time, he arrived here January 27th, 2012 and I followed him December 12th, 2012. Being separated from each other for so long was not easy, but we made it.

Our first steps led us to Our Lady of Hope Church and among the first welcoming faces we get to know was Magda Arsenault, who was born in Hungary, about 30 km. from where we were born. Even the name of the church made us hopeful and it became the only place where we could feel at home. Spending some time in the church and around the church, we noticed that Thursday nights the parking lot is pretty full and that made me curious. I wished to know what was going on, especially because we were longing for a community where we could belong but we could not find any at that time. It was shocking enough that there are no weekday masses where people holding a job can regularly attend and we also figured that there is no mass offered every day of the week. We used to go to church and to Mass every day – before or after work and we realized we had not appreciated enough how blessed and spoiled we were. We used to live in a town the same size as Sudbury and in our historical downtown we literally had a Catholic Church on every corner, offering masses every day, early in the morning or late in the afternoon – at

different times, covering all the needs. We were actively participating in 2 prayer groups and we were suddenly without all that in a foreign country.

Going to Mass was not easy on us. Trying to pray and praise the Lord in a language that we don't fully understand...well, let's put it this way: it was a challenge. So we needed some courage to enter the door on Thursday night and discover what is going on there. That was almost 4 years ago and I still remember what Father Patrick was preaching about, not only because he referred exactly the same talk 2 more times since, but because at that time I could not understand the language so well that I could understand with my brain what he was talking about. Plus, Father Pat's accent was so foreign to me and that compromised even more my ability to understand, comprehend and process what he said. His words about the yoke went right to my heart, challenged my mind but none of this could have happened without the Lord and without the Holy Spirit. I went back to our rental that night and told my husband that I attended a Mass and that was a miracle as simple as it always should be. I told him, he has to come with me next time, because this is HOME. Being honest with you, I was not delighted to get to know that this prayer group is a charismatic prayer group. We had some negative experiences and not nice memories of several burdens made by humans who misunderstood the message in the past. On the other hand, Father Patrick and the atmosphere at the church were convincing enough to give it a try and go back the next Thursday. This is how our story with the prayer group began.

We learned about the Chapel and the Chapel was calling us by name. We think, without that we would have already run away.

We got to learn how the prayer group works and how the foundation is really the Lord Jesus, the Holy Spirit, Our Holy Mother, the Chapel, the Sacraments and seeking the Lord's will in all things. This experience could not be compared to anything else that we knew before. We talked about this a lot, because our ways were always crossed somehow by charismatic groups and we knew we have something to do with them, because this is happening all the time and all over again. We just have no idea what the Lord wants us to learn from those experiences. Now, the picture seems to be clearer though we are still seeing through a cloudy glass. We are glad that we are here, we are glad that the Lord led us here. We still have no idea what is He inviting us to do here. We have no doubt that this prayer group is the reason why we ended up crossing the ocean and coming to Sudbury. However, our staying here was put to the test in so many ways.

We were here on working visas and we had to spend 3 years in the country before we could apply for permanent residency. By the time we were eligible for the permanent residency, the law had changed, so we had to start the paperwork from scratch. There is a lot to prepare for permanent residency application, we knew it would be a long process and we wanted to give enough time to succeed with it, so after accomplishing the 3-year requirement we started to get the ball rolling. That time we did not know that this process would take a little bit longer than 2 years all together. Partially, because there were some other changes implemented in the process and partially because the conditions were more extreme than they looked at first sight. The first year we had not been too worried, it was viewed more as an unnecessary and extra burden, which is long, complicated but manageable. Last year in March we were anxious about doing our language exams and that was the time when we asked for prayers from the prayer group. That happened in a funny way and not on purpose though. Before the Holy Week of Easter, there was the Mass of the Chrism in the diocese

and the Bishop cancelled every other Mass. The prayer group decided to gather and pray for its members that day and Terry specifically invited us to be prayed with for our dream: to ask the Lord for having children. We had to tell him that we wouldn't be able to attend, because the next day we had the language exams in Toronto for our permanent residency application. We have not been prayed with since for that original intention, but we believe the Lord has different ways to gather His people to pray for the right thing. After a month, we got the tests results, we did pass and we thought the biggest obstacle to becoming permanent residents was out of the way. Do you know what happened? We were wrong and the real obstacles had just started to show up. Not making you bored with all the details, I can tell you that the process had more traps than we could imagine and according to human calculation we had no chance, no solution. We were in despair, we tried to pray and seek the Lord's will but we got overwhelmed and discouraged. We could not concentrate and we started to lose hope on staying here.

I am not saying that going back to Hungary is a bad option and we still don't know how long our journey will keep us here. It just has not felt right, despite the fact that our family, our roots, our friends are there hoping for us going back at one point. It has not felt right, despite the fact that our prayer groups overseas are still counting on us and keeping us involved with everything that they are doing, organizing, etc. Every week we get their itinerary for the week, they send us the prayer schedule and we participate in the chain of prayers as well. You can see, going home is not a bad option, however, it still feels premature or bad timing for us.

We did not know what to do at that time and we could share our thoughts and feelings with some members of the prayer group in May and the miracle happened. You might think that the miracle was that we got the paperwork done and accepted. We think that might be part of the package, but the miracle was the joint effort that we experienced

and we started to live through this intention. The miracle was that people hugged us, encouraged us and we got to know how much this community takes care of its members. The miracle was that we felt welcomed, needed and loved. We are not necessarily part of each other's every day life, but we got to be part of the living body of Christ and we could feel that every single cell counts in this body of His. By the time June arrived our case looked worse than ever and we felt peace like never before. The despair was gone, we could also pray for this intention in a way that we wished to seek for God's will, whatever it might be and accept it. Sometimes we considered giving up this fight, not because we did not believe that it is possible, but sometimes it is hard to figure why you experience so much resistance. You have it because it is not the right direction, or you have it because where something good is happening the other side gets stronger to destroy it? When we had the temptation to give up this process, the next day we got news that the people who live in our house back in Hungary sold their apartment and they have nowhere else to go. We got the message and so we persisted.

From June on we felt blessed, safe and okay, even though sometimes it was not only mentally but physically challenging to follow and fulfill the requirements of the paperwork, or brainstorming about alternatives to find solutions to specific problems. We could file our application at the end of November with the help of your prayers and with the Lord's blessing.

Our status expired the last day of December and we had no word on the decision and our lawyer was very sceptical all the way along. From January on we had no real status, no health insurance in Canada, but we could legally stay and work as long as we don't leave the country. We expected an answer from the government in 6-11 months after filing the application and not having health care was not too comforting in the meantime. I did slide once in early January in the middle of a street crossing and fell. While being stretched on the road the only

thing that I could pray for was, please Lord don't let me be hit by a car, I don't have health insurance.

Do you know what happened at the end? We got accepted as permanent residents in record time: 3 and a half months. The lawyer still doesn't understand it. Do you understand? You do, because you were the ones making the miracle happen. You were the ones who did care every single day and kept our intentions not only in your heart but asking the Lord to help us with it. I don't know and I don't want to know where we would be without you, but this love, care and help that we have been experiencing leave us speechless. When we came and announced that we were granted the permanent residency, the joy of yours was incredible. We cannot say thank you enough, thank you and praise the Lord for this prayer group, for you, for you letting your heart be opened up to Him, and shaped by Him. God bless you and please continue to have such a close relationship with our Creator for His glory. He is our strength; please continue to add our portion to His work. Thank you.
