

FROM THE DESK OF THE SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR ... **MAMMON**

(My Reflection on the Gospel of the 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time A)

Jesus in today's Gospel draws His followers attention to Mammon (the god of money and wealth). He says, "You cannot serve God and mammon."

Mammon, from time immemorial (precisely, the New Testament era) is referred to as the god of money and greed.

Peter Binsfeld, in his classification of demons refers to "mammon" as the demon of one of the seven deadly sins: "greed". Archbishop Fulton John Sheen in one of his audio tapes talks about the three gods that have held Christians captive: **Baccus** (the god of wine), **Eros** (the god of sex) and **Mammon** (the god of money/wealth).

Jesus isn't against money or its relevance and use. He knows very well that without money we cannot get medication when we are sick; we cannot fuel our vehicle to make a trip; we cannot buy a gift for our loved ones; we cannot feed our families and pay bills.

What Jesus therefore is saying is:

1. That we shouldn't make money a god:

The greatest competitor of our desire for God is our desire for money. This desire to be rich is strong and controlling within us and can push us to worship money even to the detriment of our relationship with God.

The first commandment says, "I am the Lord your God. You shall have no other god except me." Jesus hence draws our attention to what the devil can do to us through money. He can make us put money or the pursuit of money, before every other thing or person, therefore making money an idol.

Do I worship money/wealth? James 1:11 says, "Riches last no longer than the flowers in the grass..." Do I worship the Rich? Hebrews 13:5-6 says, "Put greed out of your lives and be content

with whatever you have; God himself has said: I will not fail you or desert you and so we can say with confidence: With the Lord to help me, I fear nothing: What can man do to (for) me."

2. That we shouldn't fall in love with money:

Love is a strong desire for emotional union with another person; it is not meant for things. Getting attached to money in such a way that you unconsciously declare it to be "your love" is what Jesus is speaking against. We fall in love with money or riches when the pursuit of it is to the detriment of our relationship with friends and family. The love of God is the beginning of wisdom but the love of money is the beginning of being "dumb". Are you in love with money? First Timothy 6:10 says, "The love of money is the root of all evils and there are some who, pursuing it, have wandered away from the faith and so given their souls any number of fatal wounds."

In the Gospel Jesus mentioned one thing that leads to the love and worship of money: Worries (worrying about our present needs and worrying about the unknown). As the saying goes, "worry is a choice we make; it is what happens when we choose to look at something other than Jesus".

Psalm 55:22 invites us to "cast all our burdens on the Lord and He shall sustain us; He shall never permit the righteous to be moved". The answer hence to our worries is neither money nor wealth; the answer to our worries is Jesus. When worries persist, remind yourself of these words, "I know not what the future holds, but I know who holds the future."

"Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things (wealth, good health, peace of mind, happiness and joy) shall be yours as well".

THE PHYSICAL MYSTERIES OF THE EUCHARIST

The Eucharist is rightly called the greatest mystery of our Catholic Faith. It is a “mystery” in two senses. First, it is a mystery because it is a religious rite. Religious rites are called “mysteries” and the celebration of the Eucharist is the supreme rite of the Church. It is also a mystery because it is something that can be known only through divine revelation and cannot be fully comprehended by reason. Being a mystery does not mean that we cannot know anything at all about the Eucharist. Rather, it means that the Eucharist is so profound that we can always learn something new about it.

The Eucharist actually contains a number of “mysteries”, in the sense meaning things that baffle or perplex. The mysteries are both supernatural and natural. The supernatural mysteries are those related to the sacramental and sacrificial aspects of the Eucharist. The natural, or physical, mysteries of the Eucharist are related to how it appears to our senses. They are called miracles.

Miracles violate the laws of nature, but they do not involve contradictions because the laws of nature are not necessities but are contingent, meaning that they depend on the will of God.

But the Eucharist differs from other miracles in one significant way. We know that a miracle is taking place only through faith. Unlike other miracles, we don’t perceive the miracles with our senses.

When the bread and wine are consecrated, we don’t see the bread and wine changed into the Body and Blood of Christ, but we know by faith in Christ’s word that it happened. The witnesses of the miracle at the wedding feast in Cana, on the other hand, actually saw with their eyes Jesus change water into wine. The miracle was not a matter of faith to them.

In the Eucharist the miracle is both what we see and what we don’t see. After the miraculous act of consecration, bread and wine still appear to be on the altar, but they are no longer there. The Body and Blood of Christ are present instead.

Other miracles we perceive with the eyes of the body, but the Eucharist with the eyes of faith.

8-year-old prays to the Blessed Sacrament

Obtains Healing for his Family

Father Patricio Hileman, the priest responsible for building Perpetual Adoration Chapels throughout Latin America, shares the touching testimony of Diego, an 8-year-old Mexican boy whose faith in the Blessed Sacrament transformed his family's reality, marked by problems related to domestic violence, alcoholism and poverty.

Father told his parish that he heard the boy preaching the following: "Those who are willing to be at the vigil at dawn, Jesus will bless a hundred times more." Father's words made the child decide to start his vigil at 3:00 a.m. This naturally caught the attention of his mother, to whom he explained that he would do it because "I want my dad to stop drinking and that we can no longer be poor."

During the first week, the mother accompanied him. The second week, Diego invited his father.

A month later, the father testified that he had experienced the love of Jesus and was healed. Right after that, he fell in love with his wife, he stopped drinking and fighting with his wife and they were able to leave poverty behind, all because of the faith of an 8-year-old, the whole family was healed.

Father states that the first commandment of perpetual adoration is to allow oneself to be "embraced" by Jesus. It is the place where we learn to rest in the heart of Jesus.

PERPETUAL ADORATION – Juarez Mexico

Juarez, Mexico, located in the state of Chihuahua in northern Mexico, was considered from 2008 to 2010 to be one of the most dangerous cities in the world, due to drug trafficking, violence and the constant struggle for power and territory between the cartels.

However, the city of 1.3 million inhabitants dropped off this list thanks to a significant decrease in the number of homicides: from 3,766 in 2010 to 256 in 2015.

Although this drop can be credited to an improvement in the work of local authorities, Father Hileman – a priest responsible for establishing Perpetual Adoration Chapels – there is a much deeper reason: Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

When a parish adores God day and night, the city is transformed. The first Adoration Chapel was opened in Juarez in 2013. At that time 40 people a day were dying because two drug gangs were fighting over the city to move drugs into the United States.

Father told how one day, when the city was under a siege, a lady was on her way to the chapel to do her Holy Hour at 3:00 a.m. when she was intercepted by six soldiers who asked her where she was heading.

When the woman told them she was going to "**the little chapel**" she proposed they accompany her to see for themselves. When they got to the Chapel the soldiers found six women making a holy hour at the 3:00 a.m. time. The ladies told the soldiers that they were praying for them 24-hours a day.

One of the soldiers fell to his knees crying in front of the Blessed Sacrament. The next day they saw him out of uniform and in the Chapel still crying his ocean of tears.

Two months after the Chapel was opened the people told Father that since the Chapel was opened there has not been one death in Juarez. It's been two months since anyone has died.

Father went on to say that during that year they opened 10 Adoration Chapels in the city. And if that isn't enough they were going to close the seminary for there were only eight seminarians and now there are 88. The Bishop told Father that all these men had attended adoration in the special Chapels.

Father also noted that the greatest miracles occur in the early hours of the morning. The early morning is when you're most at peace, when you hear God better, your mind, your heart is more tranquil, you're there alone for God.

WORDS FROM THE LORD FEBRUARY 2017

He wants to give you a sample of His love, which is only a sample, and there's so much more.

While Terry was speaking, I had a sense that the Lord was asking us to do something. I should have spoken up right away, and I ask the Lord's forgiveness for not doing that, but I'm telling you now.


First He gave me a picture. We were all walking up to the altar and presenting Him a letter, a letter each one of us wrote. Terry said to tell Him everything that is in our hearts. The Lord said, write Me a letter and tell Me what is in your heart: every joy, every sorrow, every fear, every doubt, every thanksgiving. Tell Him about all your pains, pains you are feeling yourself, the pain you are feeling of others, all those people you are praying for. Tell Him about the ones you are praying for, for their salvation. Tell Him everything that is in your heart, and then bring it to Him and lay it at the foot of the altar.

So I invite you to do that. This week, in your private moments, write Him a letter. Tell Him what is in your heart. Next week bring it. We'll have a basket here for you, and you can put it in the basket. And at the end of the prayer meeting I will bring it and place it in front of the Lord in the chapel and leave it there. No one will read it but the Lord. That's between you and the Lord. And be honest with Him. By being honest with Him you are being honest with yourself. And don't forget to fill it with your hopes, your dreams, your desires, and thank Him for all the graces and blessings He has showered on you, and will shower on you. Thank you.

The Secret Of Pope Francis' Serenity: The Sleeping St. Joseph

Pope Francis states: "My Peace is a gift of the Lord."



"If there is a problem, I write a note to St. Joseph and put it under a statue that I have in my room. It is the statue of St. Joseph sleeping."

To those who ask him what was the secret of his "serenity", the Pope replied jokingly: "I do not take tranquilizers!" He added: "The Italians give something: to live in peace we need a healthy indifference.

"What I am experiencing is a completely new experience for me. In Buenos Aires, I was anxious, I admit. I felt more tense and worried. In short, I was not like now."

Now in fact, he claims to have had "a very special experience of profound peace since I was elected. It does not abandon me. I live in peace. I cannot explain."

Then, he says that "if there is a problem, I write a note to St. Joseph and put it under a statue that I have in my room. It is a statue of St. Joseph sleeping. And now he sleeps on a mattress of notes! That's why I sleep well: it is the grace of God.

The Pope also stressed that he often prays: "I love the breviary so much and never leave it. Mass every day. The rosary....when I pray, I always take the Bible. And my peace grows. I do not know if this is the secret. My peace is a gift of the Lord."
