Dear Friends and benefactors,

Greetings to you from the SMA Fathers (Society of African Missions) from Montreal. This newsletter arrives at a very bad moment for Africa, the land of our mission. The black continent is perhaps facing the worst challenge in its entire history: famine looming on the horizon, over population, falling prices of raw materials, lack of savings and desertification.

Africa adds 60 million to its population every two years. But, does the continent have the means to provide food, education and employment to these waves of rising new generations? Africa now has one billion living in its midst and the projected estimates are that will reach 2 billion in the year 2030. India, for example, with 1.2 billion people adds 9 million to its population every year. And though the Indian economy is progressing at a faster rate than its demography, India is looking for ways to still curtail this rate of increase. Should Africa then seek to imitate countries like India? All of us together must begin a think-tank on this subject.

It looks like the entire mankind has just reached a critical point. It is even said that the war in Syria was caused by the influx of 5 million farmers who came to settle in the capital, Damascus. Our confreres who work in Nigeria speak of the explosive cocktail on which they are sitting: Boko Haram would be a scape-goat. The real reasons behind that country's woes would be global warming, lack of resources due to overcrowding, no more infrastructure building and so no more work, etc.

The celebrations of the Holy Week turned our attention to the Cross radiant with light emanating from the risen Christ! **“They shall look on him whom they have pierced” (John 19:37).** **“Let us not allow signs of destruction and death to accompany the progress of the world” (Pope Francis, homily of his inaugural mass on 19.03.2013).**

Happy Easter to all of you! In this new season of life springing unto eternal life let us keep in mind that life wins over death and that light wins over darkness. May dawn the new heavens and the new earth, promised by God through Saint Paul. And may that hope bring you joy! We keep you in our prayers. Thank you ever so much for your invaluable support through these years. May the risen Lord bless you and keep you in his care.

She gave many talks in the Life in the Spirit and Growth in the Spirit Seminars and served as a discussion leader in almost every series of seminars we sponsored. Marie helped plan and was actively involved in all our special weekends, retreats, days of Reflection and conferences.

It was primarily through Marie's support that the Prayer Community began sponsoring the Perpetual Adoration Chapel at Our Lady Of Hope Church. Marie served as a member of its coordinating team and later was responsible, along with Jack, for the scheduling of adorers for the 168 hours per week. There is so much that Marie has contributed to over the years that it is difficult to list them all.

But, there is one thing that Marie did each month. She produced a 12-page newsletter of our prayer community and the spiritual activities in the Sudbury Region and beyond in the Diocese of Sault Ste. Marie. She would not print anything without permission from the author and it had to be true to the teachings of the Church. This newsletter was made available to all far and wide who requested it.

Marie was also the head of the Word Gift ministry within the prayer community. What is the Word Gift ministry, you ask?? The Lord anoints certain people in the prayer community to speak His words through scripture readings, special anointings and visions.. The Lord wants to get His message across to us and hence, these special anointings to special people of His choosing.

Marie was the head of this ministry and had this special anointing. The Lord truly anointed her to speak His words and to have special visions that He gave her which she shared with the whole community. These words and visions had to be true, had to be sincere and had to be discerned as from The Lord. We are sure that when she saw The Lord on Saturday, the 8th, they had quite a lengthy conversation on this matter.

FROM THE CATECHISM

WHAT IS PRAYER?

“For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embrace both trial and joy.”

- St. Therese of Lisieux

PRAYER AS GOD’S GIFT

“Prayer is the raising of one’s mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God.” (St John Damascene)

But when we pray, do we speak from the height of our pride and will, or, “out of the depths of a humble and contrite heart? (Psalm 130:1)

He who humbles himself will be exalted (Luke 18:9-14).

Humility is the foundation of prayer. Only when we humbly acknowledge that “we do not know how to pray as we ought,” (Romans 8:26) are we ready to receive freely the gift of prayer. “Man is a beggar before God” (St. Augustine)

“If you knew the gift of God (John 4:10). The wonder of prayer is revealed beside the well where we come seeking water. There, Christ comes to meet every human being. It is he who first seeks us and asks us for a drink. Jesus thirsts; his asking arises from the depths of God’s desire for us. Whether we realize it or not, prayer is the encounter of God’s thirst with ours. God thirsts that we may thirst for him.” (St Augustine)

PRAYER AS COVENANT

Where does prayer come from? Whether prayer is expressed in words or gestures, it is the whole man who prays. But in naming the source of prayer, Scripture speaks sometimes of the soul or the spirit, but most often of the heart (more than a thousand times). According to Scripture, it is the **heart** that prays. If our heart is far from God, the words of prayer are in vain.

Christian prayer is a covenant relationship between God and man in Christ. It is the action of God and of man, springing forth from both the Holy Spirit and ourselves, wholly directed to the Father, in union with the human will of the Son of God made man.

PRAYER AS COMMUNION

In the New Covenant, prayer is the living relationship of the children of God with their Father who is good beyond measure, with his Son, Jesus Christ and with the Holy Spirit. The grace of the Kingdom is “the union of the entire holy and royal Trinity . . . with the whole human spirit” (St Gregory of Nazianzus). Thus, the life of prayer is the habit of being in the presence of the thrice-holy God and in communion with Him.

Mom paused and thought for a moment about what she would say.


