VISION

The little servants of Christ the King prayer community is a spiritual group within the Catholic Church in the Diocese of Sault Ste. Marie. It is incorporated and designated as a registered charity under the income tax act. Our goal is to advance and teach the Message of Jesus Christ as announced and practiced by the Catholic Church with an emphasis on having a personal relationship with Jesus and expressing the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Our time and resources are dedicated to the work of **EVANGELIZATION**.

In everything we do, everyone is invited from the different Sectors of our Diocese (English, French, and Native). Although, all our activities are conducted in English, we do everything possible to reach out to all.

Outside our weekly meetings, we use the Diocesan office, regular mail, E-mail (for approximately 350 members), phone calls, Facebook, YouTube, and our website for all our outreach.

The prayer community is divided into **THREE STREAMS**:

STREAM 1. Building our faith through Weekly prayer meetings and the celebration of the Holy Eucharist (Mass).

STREAM 2. Promoting Our Chapel of Perpetual Adoration of the Holy Eucharist.

STREAM 3. Teaching through special days of reflection.

- a.** Lenten Mission of 5 weeks.
- b.** Annual Pentecost, Trinity and Corpus Christi Retreats.
- c.** Life in the Spirit and Future Growth seminars.
- d.** Special Fall Retreats.

We are a group that rely wholly on the guidance of the Holy Spirit and the patronage of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our Mother of Perpetual Help.

Re: Mission Statement October 26th, 2009.***

OUR MISSION STATEMENT IS: (PART 1)

If we live by the truth and in love, we shall grow in all ways into Christ, who is the head by whom the whole body is fitted and joined together, every joint adding its own strength, for each separate part to work according to its function. So the body grows until it has built itself fully up, in love (Ephesians 4: 15-16).

I want you to really listen to what it's saying because so often we miss it. Here's the thing we have to look at and listen to. It says, "To some His gift was that they should be apostles, to some prophets, to some evangelists, to some pastors and teachers." I think he could have gone on and on saying to each one of us, "He has called us and given us a special gift". "So that the saints together," – and the saints he is talking about happens to be you and me, that's who Paul is talking to – the saints – that's you and me, "so that the saints together make a unity in the work of service."

Hear what he's saying. That every person has been given a specific gift in their uniqueness and it's a specific gift He's given to each person and together they make a unity in the work of service in building up the body of Christ, which we are. So every person in this building tonight has been given a special gift and a special calling from the Lord to build up the body, the Church, which is Jesus Christ. We are the Church. In this way, and once every person understands the gift that God has given them and the calling in which He wants us to use that gift, in this way we are all to come to unity in our faith and in our knowledge of the Son of God. That's heavy stuff.

He's saying I don't go to God all by my lonely self. And I don't come to know God by my lonely self. "In this way we all come to unity in our faith and in our knowledge of the Son of God until we become the perfect Man." In the Bible that perfect man is a capital "M" which is Jesus Christ.

That all of us together, with the power of Christ, come to unity in our faith and in our knowledge of the Son of God and to become that perfect Man all together, which the Man is Jesus Christ, His body.

We all come together to be the body of Jesus Christ. "Until we become the perfect Man, fully mature." In other words, He wants us to grow up and become the body of Jesus Christ, with the fullness of Christ Himself in us. We could meditate on that at least for a couple of months.

We go on to the next part. He says, "If we live by the truth and in love," that's what He's telling us. If we, every one of us in this church, if we live by the truth. Who is the truth? "I am the way, the truth and the life." If we live by the truth of Jesus Christ and we live in love, we shall grow all ways into Christ.

That's the secret for us to become the body of Jesus Christ and to grow, by seeking the truth and to love, in love. And then he says, "Then we shall grow in all ways into Christ who is the head by whom the whole body is fitted and joined together; every joint adding its own strength for each separate part to work according to its function."

What's he saying? Every one of us has the job to discover our special gift for the building up of the church. And I need a community to discover that because I can't discover it by myself. But my job is also to point out your gifts. And if each of us is looking at each other in love and in truth we're telling each other what our gifts are to be in the body of Jesus Christ.

The Holy Rosary, Lectors, Ministers Of the Cup, Greeters Ministries

My name is Christine Charlton.

I have been a little servant of this vibrant prayer community since 1995. This prayer community has been a great blessing in my life since I have grown spiritually because of the effective teachings of our holy priests and through praise and worship; I have catapulted in love towards the Most Holy Trinity in a very powerful way.

Presently, I am in charge of the Holy Rosary, the Lectors,
the Ministers of the Cup and the Greeters.

The Holy Rosary

Our Blessed Mother said to St. Dominic and to Blessed Alan tie la Roche: "To all those who shall pray my Rosary devoutly, I promise my special protection and great graces." And also, "Whoever recites my Rosary devoutly, reflecting on the mysteries, shall never be overwhelmed by misfortune." Twice she stressed to pray 'devoutly'. What does this mean? We lead the Holy Rosary with a good tone of voice; appropriate pace and most importantly, our prayers must come from the heart.

Lectors

It is a privilege to proclaim the living Word of God! This ministry must be treated very seriously and with great dignity. We deliver the message by projecting our voice, we are mindful of clarity, a good tone and appropriate pace. As we proclaim the Word of God with our own faith, we evoke the faith in others. All Lectors are advised to have the "Living in Christ" booklet so that they can prepare themselves thoroughly for this very important mission. We dress in a way that can be an example for others.

Ministers of the Cup

To be a Minister of the Cup, we need to live an exemplary Christian life. We must show great devotion to the Holy Eucharist and to the Precious Blood and be an example of piety and reverence. With immense joy and honour we present the Precious Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ to the faithful! The whole and entire Christ is present in the Precious Blood!

When an individual approaches us, we wait till he or she completes the bow, we then make eye contact and say with confidence and conviction these powerful words: "The Blood of Christ". We wait for the person to profess his or her faith by saying: "Amen". We then offer the chalice to the person and afterwards wipe the rim of the chalice and turn the cup a quarter of a turn. When our mission is completed, we place the empty chalices with their purificators on the credence table. We remain standing on the Sanctuary quietly and with dignity until the Blessed Sacrament is returned to the Tabernacle. We then descend the steps, turn and bow to the altar and return to our seats. We dress with dignity and modesty.

Greeters

A Greeter must be naturally friendly. Superficiality must be avoided at all times. We are to shine and share the radiance of Christ with others. We give love tokens to others. A smile, a hug, a kind word, a sincere question...We share our warmth and love. We are Givers!

Heart to Heart Intercession



The Lord instructed us to pray not only for our own personal needs but to reach out and pray for others as well. (**1 Timothy 2:1-6**)

Hebrews 7:25 speaks of Jesus as a high priest that is still interceding on our behalf. The Lord is looking for men and women today that are willing to enter into this ministry with Him. He has always sought people that would “stand in the gap” for others (**Ezekiel 22:30-31**). He needs spiritual people who will selflessly intercede on behalf of others. We have answered that call twenty-one years ago and have been faithful meeting one day a week.

Ten years ago when we first met at the Diocese Centre the Lord blessed us with the following scripture: “Now and for the future, my eyes are open and my ears attentive to the prayer that is offered in this place” (**2 Chronicle 7:15**).

Is the Lord speaking to you? Take this leap of faith and join us for the morning session, the afternoon session or for both sessions. The morning session, 10:30 AM to 12:00 PM to pray for the priests, the afternoon session, 1:00 PM to 3:00 PM to pray for your family, your friends, your loved ones, and the prayer community.

Our Cancer Ministry

Our Cancer Ministry under the mantle of the little servants of Christ The King prayer community began on September 28, 1998. Mrs. Denise Blais and Mrs. Jackie Giommi, who were both called home by the Lord, were the leaders of this ministry. Both women had cancer themselves and embraced their own illness with deep faith and courage. Through their illness, they were able to offer hope and consolation to other cancer survivors.

Due to many requests for prayers, a list of the names of cancer patients has existed since the beginning of this ministry. To date we have over 7,690 names and it continues to grow. **The names submitted are kept totally confidential in a very small font that no one can read and are never taken off the list.** Thursday evening the names are placed at the altar at Our Lady of Hope church.

Over the years our group remains faithful to their commitment of prayer for all those living with cancer, their caregivers, and family members. We also include any petitions offered at that time such as addictions, suicide, all those living in hospice, a family member who needs help, and many more. Thursday evenings we meet in the chapel before the Tabernacle at Our Lady of Hope Church between 6:00 and 6:30 p.m. We invite anyone who would like to join us in prayer at that time to do so.

WORDS FROM THE LORD – AUGUST 2019

Editor's note: As you read, pray about and reflect on the words spoken to us through the Prophetic Ministry. What is the Lord saying to you personally? Space for your response follows each prophecy.

August 22, 2019

My beloved ones, I am here among you as your mother and I ask you this: are you any closer to my Son today than you were six months ago? Do you know my Son better than you knew Him six months ago? Do you know His Word better than you knew six months ago? If you do not know Him any better, if you don't love Him any more and you don't know His Word and His message to you, you have not grown my beloved ones, you're stagnant.

Within your marriage or with your children when they were little, if you only talked to them once a week, would you have had a relationship? If you were an athlete but you never practiced except possibly half an hour every week, would you have advanced? If you studied music but you never played an instrument or looked at a note, would you have advanced? It is the same with your spiritual life. You need to spend time with my Son. You might have to sit in His presence and be still and listen to Him as He tries to teach you, as He tries to bring you closer to Himself. Unless you learn to be still and truly listen to Him, you will never grow. You will be stagnant.

Do you really heed His commandments? Do you find them difficult? And if so, do you tell Him that? As your best friend, as your companion, your heavenly spouse, do you remind Him you can do nothing outside of Him? He knows it but He wants you to know it.

My beloved ones, I am your mother and I'm trying to teach you that unless you keep His commandments and spend more time with my Son, you will not grow. You will regress but you will not grow and you will be stagnant. My Son told you either be hot or cold, but if you are lukewarm I'll spew you out. If you're lukewarm, indifferent, He cannot teach you. He's holding out His graces but if you're too proud to accept them, you will not grow.

My beloved ones, I pray for you. Now, learn to know my Son, how much He loves you and I love you.

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August 29, 2019

My beloved ones, I am in your midst, I am within you. Trust Me. Trust Me when I tell you that I am within you. You are Mine.

My beloved ones, am I number one in your life? Do you live the first commandment: You are to love Me with all your heart and soul, with all your strength and your whole being. Do you have other gods in your life? Are there other things that are more important than I am? My beloved ones, I died for you upon the cross. I thought of you, I saw you when I hung upon the cross. I prayed for you when I said, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." So, when you sin, when you stray from the path, remember My prayer for you. Remember My arms are always wide open to welcome you back home into My arms, close to My heart, because, My beloved ones, I love you, I love you with an everlasting love. I am love, I am mercy. Perpetual Adoration of The Blessed Sacrament

When John Paul II instituted Eucharistic Adoration at St. Peter's Basilica in 1981, he said, "The best way of establishing peace on the face of the earth is through -- Perpetual Adoration of The Blessed Sacrament". Mother Teresa, when asked, "What will convert America and save the world", replied, "My answer is prayer. What we need is for every parish to come before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in holy hours of prayer.

What are they talking about? Our Catholic Faith tradition tells us that The Eucharist is the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ, and therefore, the whole Christ is truly present in the Eucharist. This is why Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament is so powerful. It develops a **strong personal relationship** with each individual as they sit in prayerful adoration before Him.

The conversion of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ, promised in the sixth chapter of John's Gospel and fulfilled at the Last Supper, is called transubstantiation, "a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ - and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood" Catechism, no. 1376. "Substance denotes the basic reality of the thing, i.e. what it is in itself." A change in appearance does not affect the substance of the thing. When the angel Raphael stood before Tobiah, his appearance was that of a "young man" but his substance was that of an angel (Tobit 5:5; 12:15).

You are in the real presence of Christ every time you step into a Catholic church where the lighted lamp or candle indicates that the Blessed Sacrament is in the tabernacle. At any such time one can be with Christ in Adoration. The term Eucharistic Adoration, however, is usually

applied to the exposition of the Sacrament to view. Christ is as fully present in the closed tabernacle as He is in the monstrance during exposition. It helps devotion to be able to look upon Him in The Host in which "The whole Christ is truly, really and substantially contained".

Eucharistic Adoration is part of Our Lady of Hope Parish. On November 1st, 2018 we completed 28 years of Adoration, 24/7. So why should we consider Eucharistic Adoration? One reason is that it works. "People are hungry for God," said Mother Teresa of Calcutta. Hundreds of people have come to this chapel and they have left with great Peace. The Lord is waiting for you to come and spend some time with Him. When we die we hope to spend eternity with Him. Wouldn't it be helpful to get to know Him before we pass from this world into the next? Come into the Adoration Chapel and see the many, many people who have made this commitment by placing their name down for a certain time each week. People see these names and they are prayed for each day by the people present. Come and spend some time with Him. You will never be disappointed and you will receive so many graces that will show up on your record when you come before Him when you leave this world. We need all the help we can get, don't you agree? Make a commitment. Come and visit Him.

Summer Holiday - 2019***

Dear friends and benefactors,

The holidays are coming to an end and after a restful summer, here we are, ready to face a new year of hard work and academic pursuits. A meaningful action plan will propel us to ever new heights and make of us new beings. If life is a journey, our calling is to advance with faith, hope and unflinching courage.

For summer this year, we have had the joy of receiving four confrères: **Fr. Fabian GBORTSU**, from Ghana but who is working in Ivory Coast, was the first to arrive for parish ministry in West Island. He was closely followed by **Albert XAVIER** from India, who came to lend a helping hand at St. Joseph's Oratory. **Habib AKPATA** from Benin is here to do replacement in Gaspé and **Cyrille HOUENOU**, who is from Benin but working in Liberia, has come for ministry in downtown Montreal.

As for the contributions we were able to make since our last newsletter **thanks to your never failing generosity**, we could mention **\$10,000** of mass intentions sent to India and Africa, another **\$10,000** sent to the Catechetical Centre of Shinyanga, Tanzania, and **\$10,000** again sent with the help of Roncalli for the printing of books for the same Centre. Also, with the help of Roncalli we sent **\$13,000** for the construction of a bore-well in Togo. We gave **\$25,000** to our Generalate in Rome as part of our fixed contribution for the upkeep of our major seminarians in different countries. We pray to God that he blesses your lives abundantly with progress and prosperity.

The General Assembly of our Society takes place every six years. This year was the year of our **General Assembly**. It lasted for the whole of the month of May. We were about 50 in all, in Rome, charting out our trajectory for the next six years to come. We elected **Fr. Antonio PORCELLATO**, an Italian, as our new Superior General, he replaces **Fr. Fachtna O'DRISCOLL**, Irish, who was till now in charge of our Society.

The Holy Father, Pope Francis, received us for a private audience in the Vatican. He concluded his talk with these words: *"Thank you for your visit and the witness that you render.
