VISION

The little servants of Christ the King prayer community is a spiritual group within the Catholic Church in the Diocese of Sault Ste. Marie. It is incorporated and designated as a registered charity under the income tax act. Our goal is to advance and teach the Message of Jesus Christ as announced and practiced by the Catholic Church with an emphasis on having a personal relationship with Jesus and expressing the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Our time and resources are dedicated to the work of **EVANGELIZATION**.

In everything we do, everyone is invited from the different Sectors of our Diocese (English, French, and Native). Although, all our activities are conducted in English, we do everything possible to reach out to all.

Outside our weekly meetings, we use the Diocesan office, regular mail, E-mail (for approximately 350 members), phone calls, Facebook, YouTube, and our website for all our outreach.

The History of the little servants of Christ The King prayer community

In May 2019, the little servants of Christ The King prayer community celebrated our forty-seventh anniversary. Who are we? We are a group of committed Catholics from across the Sudbury region, who surrendered fully to Jesus Christ as our Lord and Saviour.

We know the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Catholic faith and we actively promote the Exposition and Perpetual Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. We honour Mary, the Mother of Jesus and have placed our prayer community under her protection as Mother of Perpetual Help.

We are loyal to our local Bishop and to the Magisterium of the Church. We give God permission to use us as He wants and continually seek His Will and follow it to the best of our ability.

We spend time both in private personal daily prayer and in group prayer, spontaneously praying together in praise and thanksgiving.

We are a community who recognizes each person's uniqueness and giftedness, sharing experiences, trials and joys. We reach out to the wider community in active service to God's People.

In May of 1972, a group of people began meeting regularly for shared prayer, firstly in a private home, then in the library at the Sudbury General Hospital. It was not long after, that this small group began to meet weekly in the basement hall at Christ the King Church. Thus began the prayer community of Christ The King.

Terry and Gerry Shannon and Larry and Magda Arsenault were part of this small group, and subsequently, Terry was invited some years later to become servant leader of the little servants of Christ The King prayer community (our new name as directed by The Lord). It was God's choice to visit us with a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit and His gifts. In spite of our own personal shortcomings, the Lord used us to usher forth a movement of His Spirit through the Charismatic Renewal in the Catholic Church in this region.

Many people who reflect on this renewal see it as a providential answer to Pope John XXIII's prayer at the beginning of the Second Vatican Council for a new Pentecost. Quote: "Renew Your wonders in this our day, as by a new Pentecost. Grant to Your Church that being of one mind, and steadfast in prayer with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and following the lead of blessed Peter, it may advance the reign of our Divine Saviour, the reign of truth and justice, the Reign of love and peace. Amen" (prayer of Pope John XXIII to The Holy Documents of Vatican II, 1962, pp709 and 793.)

We have been blessed with gifted Spiritual Directors who have built the prayer community on a strong foundation of prayer, both personal and communal; the Sacraments; the Lord's Word and the teachings of the Magisterium of the Church.

The History of the little servants of Christ The King prayer community

In June 1981, Msgr. Raymond Farrell came to Sudbury as pastor of Christ the King Church, and became our Spiritual Director. Under the direction of Bishop Jean-Louis Plouffe the prayer community moved to Our Lady of Perpetual Help (later named Our Lady of Hope) as our spiritual home, when Fr. Farrell became pastor there.

Father Patrick O'kenyi sma was appointed our Spiritual Director since Msgr. Farrell's illness and ultimate death on April 10, 2014. After much prayer and reflection, the Perpetual Adoration Chapel opened twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, and remains to this day a powerful place of worship.

In preparation for the opening of the Perpetual Adoration Chapel, Msgr. Farrell visited every council of the Knights of Columbus in this region, inviting them to commit to spending several hours each week praying for our Bishop and priests of our Diocese.

SOME PRAYER GROUP ACTIVITIES:

Over these past forty-seven years we have facilitated the Life in The Spirit Seminars and Growth in The Spirit Seminars over eighty times. These courses are used as the foundation for developing a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. Many thousands have taken these seminars which are very, very powerful. The application form for the course is located on Page 3 of this newsletter.

Over these years, we have been blessed with wonderful guest speakers who have preached numerous weekend retreats, seminars, days of reflection and special teaching courses.

The highlight of our many guest speakers was Cardinal Sean O'Malley of Boston, who accepted our invitation to join us on October 14, 2009 honouring our priests during the Year for Priests. It was a joyous and wonderful celebration! Cardinal O'Malley was celebrant and homilist for the Mass and keynote speaker at the banquet which followed. Over eighty-five priests and five hundred and fifty people from across our diocese were present for this wonderful celebration, who gathered together to pray, reflect, to thank and to honour the priests of our Diocese of Sault Ste. Marie.

Over these years, we have sponsored a Lenten Mission each Saturday morning for five weeks during Lent. Twice a year, a special Mass for all those living with cancer and other terminal illnesses, their caregivers and family members is celebrated.

Each week before the prayer meeting, a DVD teaching series is shown on the large screen at Our Lady of Hope Church. At the present moment, because of church renovations, we are pausing with the DVD presentations, which will resume soon.

In everything we do, everyone is most welcome to attend and participate in all our activities.

The History of the little servants of Christ The King prayer community

Our prayer meetings are held each Thursday evening year round, for prayer, praise and song honouring God our Father, our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

The evening begins with the Rosary at 6:45, song and praise at 7:20, and the Celebration of the Eucharist at 8:00 p.m. At the conclusion of Mass, all who wish may be prayed with for their own individual intentions. The Sacrament of the Sick is administered on the last Thursday of every month by the priests of the prayer community.

Many, many hundreds of people have been involved with the prayer community over the years, and many have remained to serve those the Lord sends to us. Within the prayer community, we have many active ministries doing God's work. We are blessed with many priests who come to celebrate with us. We hear fantastic homilies each week by the priest who is the celebrant.

It is because of the commitment and dedicated service to the Lord and His people that the prayer community continues to be the "beacon on the hill" that He is calling us to be.

For all who read this, we pray that you will invite the Lord Jesus to enter into your heart in a special way, to renew you and strengthen you, that you will grow deeply in love with Him, so that you will seek and follow the Will of God our Father.

Evangelization is the main goal of the prayer community. Pope Francis summed up three objectives of evangelization: firstly – to proclaim the Gospel to all people; secondly – to help bring about recommitment to those who already received the Gospel but live it only nominally; and, thirdly - to deepen the Gospel in the lives of believers, so that we all can "hand on the faith" to coming generations. Praise be to God!

This ministry began in January of 1995. When people are prayed with at our Thursday night prayer meetings, and they 'rest in The Spirit', the people of the Compassion Ministry pray for them while they are being prayed with and when they are 'resting' in the Spirit. They do not 'touch' unless required to do so.

A person is invited into this ministry after they have made the 'Life in the Spirit' seminars, and follow up with the 'Growth in the Spirit' seminars when it becomes available, and also make the commitment to attend the prayer meetings on Thursday nights.

This group meets five or six times a year, separate from the prayer group meeting. The head of this ministry along with group leaders and assistant group leaders meet beforehand to see what the Lord wants in regards to preparation, teaching and training. All members of this ministry are invited to attend a half-day of prayer, praise and specialized learning.

The members also offer prayer support for each other and each member is free to request prayers for themselves or for members of their family. We also offer prayer support for all other ministries of the prayer group and members of the prayer group.

The goal and purpose of the Music Ministry is to enhance the experience of praise and worship by heightening the Word of God through music. With strong musical leadership, the Music Ministry is empowered by the Holy Spirit, and strives to enable the dual purpose of music in the liturgy; that being the glorification of God and the sanctification of the faithful.

Music is the beauty that sets the stage for the encounter with the Incarnate Lord. It sets the stage for the heart, the mind, and the body to be elevated into heavenly worship. Music serves and prepares the table, but it is not the feast. It clears the room of the heart and mind that comes in so busy from the outside world. Sacred music prepares us to be able to receive the fullness of grace in the Holy Sacrifice of the Altar.

Coming together at Mass draws us into a single worshipping community. The entrance song in particular helps transform us into a prayer community with a common purpose. It serves the liturgical assembly by enabling us to express faith through song. We use the various lyrics and melodies to convey what we ourselves often cannot put into words. Music allows the words of the liturgy to speak more fully, and embraces the wonders of God, of the life, death and resurrection of Christ, and of the power of the Holy Spirit among us. Quite often words take on a much deeper meaning when sung. The melody of favourite songs has become as much a part of their message, as the lyrics. The meaning of a Mass response, or hymn, is heightened if the melody reflects what the words express. The joyful Celtic Alleluia, for example, is popular because the joyous lifting melody expresses so well the Good News, which it announces. An effective musical setting conveys a meaning that goes beyond the words themselves. Music allows us to express joy and enthusiasm, and also sadness and despair. In addition, it plays an important part in helping us enter into the spirit of the different liturgical seasons. The sombre tone of Good Friday is so effectively captured in songs such as “At The Cross”. The music of Easter enables us to express our joy in the resurrection of Christ; then we have Advent, Christmas, Lent, Ordinary Time and other Feasts, Solemnities and Festivals.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, in its section on liturgical music, quotes the famous expression of St. Augustine: “He who sings, prays twice”. So, help us raise our hearts and minds to praise and worship our God!

THE CHAPEL OF PERPETUAL ADORATION HISTORY

The Chapel of Perpetual Adoration came about with the help of many people. In early 1990, two members of the prayer community, Mrs. Annette Ladouceur and Sister Marie Larivière approached Fr. Farrell about starting a Perpetual Adoration Chapel.

After much prayer, it was discerned that The Lord wanted this Chapel. Fr. Farrell then spoke to Bishop Plouffe who gave his consent. Father then approached the parish council who also agreed, and stated that when the church was first designed, Father Brennan had envisioned a chapel in that very spot which was included in the original plans.

A church architect friend of Fr. Farrell's designed the chapel at no cost. The parish Ladies Auxiliary bought the carpet; the prayer group purchased 14 Krug arm chairs; the eight-foot commitment board, and the eight-foot ledge below the board. Father Farrell's sister donated the monstrance and a special wall hanging, and the Sisters of the Precious Blood in North Bay repainted the statue of Our Lady. It has truly been a blessing that so many people helped to bring this chapel to fruition so quickly.

On November 1st, 1990 Bishop Jean-Louis Plouffe blessed the Chapel. When the Lord has a plan and we listen and follow it, everything falls into place.

From the beginning, the service group prayed together in unity each step along the way – one step at a time, from the chapel's conception to its implementation, seeking The Lord's perfect will.

Father Farrell spoke to all the Knights of Columbus councils and Larry Arsenault spoke to all the CWL's in the area.

Shortly after the chapel opened a petition box was placed at the foot of the altar, where anyone could write out their requests to The Lord. Within a short time, a thanksgiving box was added as many people reported that their requests were answered.

People have been cured of alcoholism, from smoking, from addictions of every kind. Family situations have been healed, and illnesses of body, mind, and spirit, etc. The thanksgiving box is often as full as the petition box. Thank you Lord! All petitions are burned when the box becomes full.

We have estimated that in the number of years the chapel has been open 24 / 7 over 600,000 hours of prayer has been offered.

WITNESS: Father Jeffrey Shannon attests that his vocation to the priesthood was solidified during his time spent each week in prayer in the chapel during his last year of university studies. He just celebrated 22 years of Ordination in June and is very happy in his priesthood. Every time he is home, he visits the Chapel each day.

ANOTHER WITNESS: At the time the chapel was opened, Father Farrell was doing many hours per day of inner healing. Consequently he drank over 20 cups of coffee a day and smoked over 2 packages of cigarettes each day. One day while he was on vacation he read an article that stated "The Lord is the overcomer". At that point, Father Farrell said to The Lord: "If that is true, Lord overcome my smoking habit and coffee habit". He continued with a little prayer. From that day on Father stated that The Lord took away his craving for both cigarettes and coffee. He was so thankful. Never did he have a cigarette after the prayer and he only had one cup of coffee per day.

There are so many witness stories that people have told us. If you do not have a committed hour or more in the Chapel, please do so as soon as possible. It will be the best decision you will ever make. God Bless.

"IN SINU JESU" is a most amazing book. When you sit in Adoration before His Holy Face, open your heart, and talk to Him as you would your best friend, a relationship begins to develop. This personal relationship is of supreme importance for you and the relationship you are growing into with our Lord.

In Part 3 we began the discussion of interceding for another, and the importance of doing it in The Lord's way. These days we seem to be interceding for others very frequently so let us do it the proper way. If this is done, then the results will be fantastic for it will be The Lord's way not ours and the result will be far better than what we could have asked for or imagined. Let us recap and freshen up our memory.

Remember, The Lord said; do not come to Me with solutions; come to Me only with your problems, and allow Me to provide the solutions. I have no need of your solutions, but when you bring Me problems, sufferings, questions, and needs, I am glorified by your confidence in My merciful love.

Pray to Me with confidence and with abandonment, and not with a secret desire to force My hand and to obtain from Me only what you have in view.

When you ask, do so with a complete abandonment to My wisdom, My love, and My perfect will. Pray in this way, and you will begin to see wonders surpassing all that you can imagine.

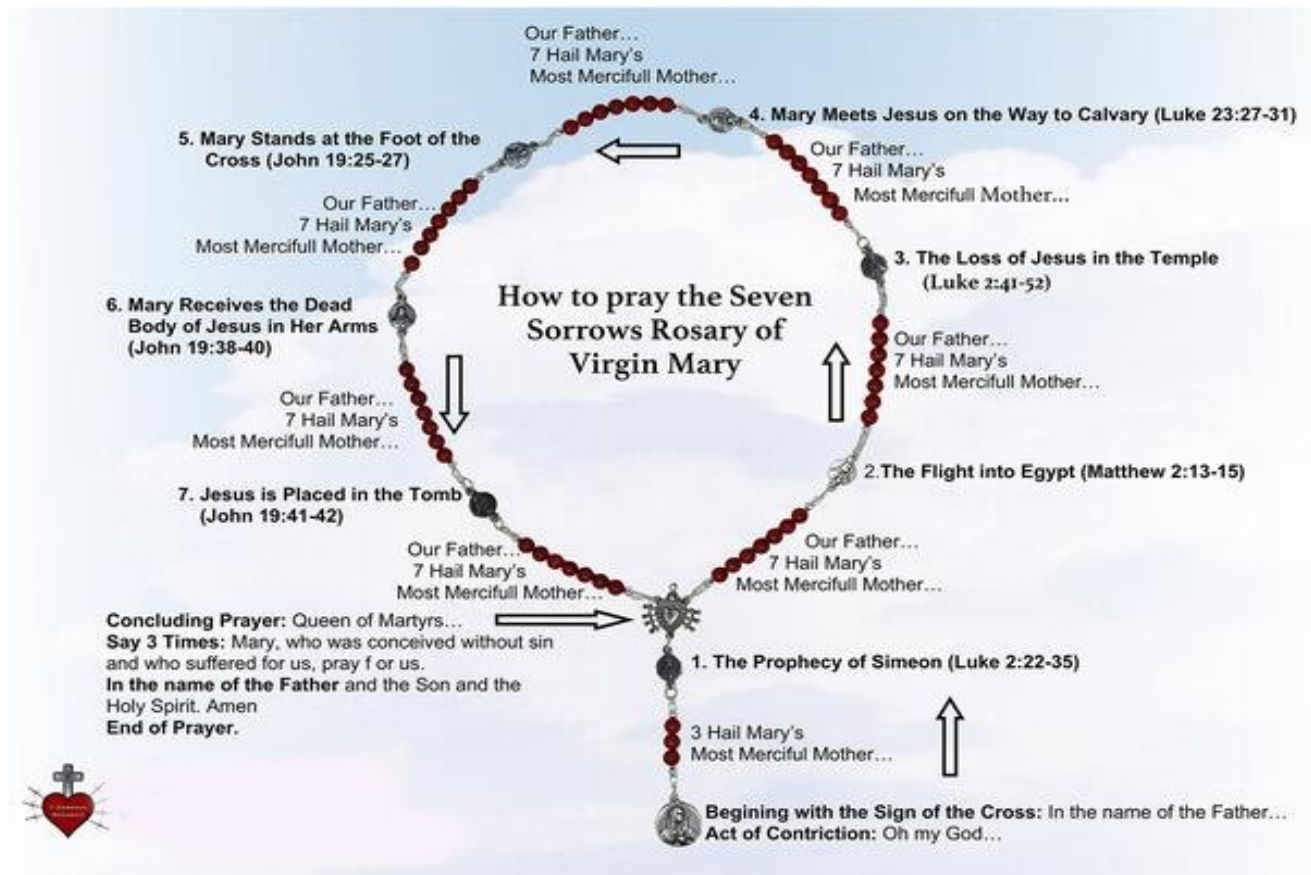
