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VISION

The little servants of Christ the King prayer community is a spiritual group within the Catholic Church in the Diocese of Sault Ste. Marie. It is incorporated and designated as a registered charity under the income tax act. Our goal is to advance and teach the Message of Jesus Christ as announced and practiced by the Catholic Church with an emphasis on having a personal relationship with Jesus and expressing the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Our time and resources are dedicated to the work of **EVANGELIZATION**.

STREAM 2. Promoting Our Chapel of Perpetual Adoration of the Holy Eucharist.


STREAM 3. Teaching through special days of reflection.

The Sacred Heart Of Jesus



Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is a devotion that focuses attention on the physical Heart as the symbol of His redemptive love.

Although tradition often situates the beginning of the practice of the devotion to the year 1000, it might be more accurate to place its birth during the time of the great mystics [St. Anselm and St. Bernard] between 1050 and 1150. By the middle ages, because of a strong emphasis on the Passion of our Lord, and because of the efforts of St. Bonaventure and St. Gertrude the Great, the devotion became popularized as a means of worshipping the mystery of Christ, living in the Church.

This devotion was promoted by great Saints, including St. Albert the Great, St. Catherine of Siena, St. Francis de Sales, as well as the great religious orders, such as the Benedictines, the Dominicans, and the Carthusians. However, it must be recorded that the Saint who is most often associated with this devotion is St. Margaret Mary Alacoque [1647-1690].

It is related in the life of this nun of the Visitation Order, that our Saviour revealed to this servant His wish that the devotion and the Feast of His Sacred Heart should be established and propagated in the Church. In this way, devout believers would, by their adoration and prayer, make reparation for the injuries His Heart constantly receives from ungrateful humanity when He is exposed in the Blessed Sacrament of the altar. It is also related that while this devout nun was

praying before the Blessed Sacrament, Jesus Christ showed her His Heart surrounded by thorns, with a cross on the top, and in a throne of flames.

"Behold the Heart," she reports that Jesus spoke to her, "that has loved humanity, and has spared nothing for them, even to consuming itself to give them pledges of Its love, but which receives from the majority of people, no other return but ingratitude, and insults toward the Sacrament of Love."

After she received the Vision of the Sacred Heart, which popularized the devotion, she was scorned by her mother superior who thought her to be delusional. The Saint took ill. Mother superior told St. Margaret Mary that she would believe the miracle of the vision if the Saint were cured. She was and St. Margaret was able to promote the devotion under the guidance of her spiritual director, St. Claude Colombiere. Several books have been published on her extensive letters, sayings and the revelations given to her by Our Lord.

In modern times it was Pope Pius IX who, in 1856, established the Feast of the Sacred Heart and encouraged the efforts of the Apostleship of Prayer - a confraternity of faithful Catholics who encourage groups, families, and communities to consecrate themselves to the Sacred Heart.

In 1928 Pope Pius XI issued his encyclical *Miserentissimus Redemptor* on reparation to the Sacred Heart. In 1956 Pope Pius XII published his encyclical *Haurietis aquas* on the nature of devotion to the Sacred Heart. †



DEVOTION TO THE SACRED HEART

Devotion to the Sacred Heart, as we know it, began about the year 1672. On repeated occasions, Jesus appeared to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation nun, in France, and during these apparitions He explained to her the devotion to His Sacred Heart as He wanted people to practice it. **He asked to be honoured in the symbol of His Heart of flesh; He asked for Acts of Reparation, for frequent Communion, Communion on the First Friday of the month, and the keeping of the Holy Hour.**

When the Catholic Church approved the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, she did not base her action only on the visions of Saint Margaret Mary. The Church approved the devotion on its own merits. There is only one Person in Jesus, and that Person was at the same time God and Man. His Heart, too, is Divine — it is the Heart of God.

There are two things that must always be found together in the devotion to the Sacred Heart: Christ's Heart of flesh and Christ's love for us. True devotion to the Sacred Heart means devotion to the Divine

Heart of Christ, insofar as His Heart represents and recalls His love for us.

In honouring the Heart of Christ, our homage lingers on the Person of Jesus in the fullness of His love. This love of Christ for us was the moving force of all He did and suffered for us — in Nazareth, on the Cross, in giving Himself in the Blessed Sacrament, in His teaching and healing, in His praying and working. When we speak of the Sacred Heart, we mean Jesus showing us His Heart, Jesus all love for us and all lovable.



The object of the Sacred Heart devotion then, is not only worship and devotion to the physical heart of Jesus, which we refer to as "*the Sacred Heart of Jesus*"; it is devotion to all that the symbol of the heart means — devotion to the person of Jesus and to the love of God for mankind — this we commonly refer to as simply *the Sacred Heart*.

1. *I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.*
2. *I will establish peace in their homes.*
3. *I will comfort them in all their afflictions.*
4. *I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.*
5. *I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.*
6. *Sinners will find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.*
7. *Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.*

9. *I will bless every place in which an image of my Heart is exposed and honored.*
10. *I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.*

Finding Peace in the Heart of Christ

A homily given by Saint Josemaría on June 17, 1966. He was canonized in 2002 by Pope John Paul II, who declared that Josemaría should be "counted among the great witnesses of Christianity."



God our Father has seen fit to grant us, in the heart of his Son, "infinite treasures of love," mercy and affection. If we want to find evidence that God loves us — that he not only listens to our prayers but anticipates them — we need only follow the same line of thought as St. Paul: "He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, will he not also give us all things in him?" (Romans 8:32).

Grace renews a man from within and converts a sinner and rebel into a good and faithful servant. The source of all grace is God's love for us. Love is revealed to us in the incarnation, the redemptive journey which Jesus Christ made on our earth, culminating in the supreme sacrifice of the cross. And on the cross it showed itself through a new sign: "One of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and at once there came out blood and water" (John 19:34). This water and blood of Jesus speaks to us of a self-sacrifice brought to the last extreme: "It is finished" (John 19:30) — everything is achieved, for the sake of love.

Today when we consider once more the central mysteries of our faith, we are surprised to see how very human gestures are used to express the deepest truths: the love of God the Father who gives up His Son, and the Son's love which calmly leads Him to Calvary. God does not approach us in power and authority. No, he "takes the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of man" (Philippians 2:7). Jesus is never distant or aloof; although sometimes in His preaching He seems very sad, because He is hurt by the evil men do. However, if we watch Him closely, we will note immediately that His anger comes from love. It is a further invitation for us to leave infidelity and sin behind. "Have I any pleasure in the death of the wicked, says the Lord God, and not rather that he should turn from his way and live?" (Ezek 18:23). These words explain Christ's whole life. They allow us to understand why he has come to us with a heart made of flesh, a heart like ours. This is a convincing proof of His love and a constant witness to the Mystery of Divine charity.

On October 16, 2016, the church of God raised another saint to her altars. The canonization of St. Manuel Gonzalez in our day is a timely gift bestowed upon us by the solicitous hand of Divine Providence. The life and mission of St. Manuel was entirely and explicitly Eucharistic.

St. Manuel Gonzalez was so outraged by the indifference in the Church a hundred years ago, what would he say today? His words are a clarion call to priests, indeed, to all of us, to arise from spiritual slumber and to draw near to the light of the Eucharistic Sun Of Love. His canonization is heaven's urgent invitation addressed to the whole Church to prostrate itself at the foot of the tabernacle. The world has become a spiritual desert for want of having recourse to the tabernacle.

Mrs. Schneider translated from Spanish to English his writings so that we could help to understand the infinite depths of love contained in the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus. He has helped to rekindle the fire of our love for the Blessed Sacrament.

St. Manuel Gonzale's writings cover a multitude of subjects, but every page he writes is underpinned by the same simple theme: a kind of Eucharistic amazement mixed with holy dismay because the Real Presence of Christ is met with the real absence of Christians in so many of our parishes. Though the Sacred Eucharistic Heart of Jesus trembles with Love for us in the Tabernacle, our hearts are often indifferent to His Love.

The Heart of Christ is as pierced and rejected today as it was on Calvary two thousand years ago. Love is not loved! The tabernacles are abandoned!

THE EUCHARIST is the answer to all our spiritual problems, because The Eucharist is Jesus Christ. This book of St. Manuel Gonzalez offers us a glimmer of light in a sea of darkness. The solution, which is very close to us, is a universal return to the Blessed Sacrament. To be restored to supernatural health, souls must nourish themselves in Eucharistic Adoration, fervent participation in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and worthy reception of Holy Communion.

Not only are souls personally nourished by The Eucharist but also their Eucharistic love obtains many graces for the sanctification of the entire church and the evangelization of the whole world. Adoration is the power source for the New Evangelization. The solution to our present crisis is simple: Eucharistic renewal is the supreme mission entrusted to our generation. The future of the Church depends upon us! There is so much more to read and to see his insights in our Church today. His wisdom is Christ centered.


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CONGRATULATORY MESSAGE TO BISHOP MARCEL DAMPHOUSSE
