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VISION

The little servants of Christ the King prayer community is a spiritual group within the Catholic Church in the Diocese of Sault Ste. Marie. The Immaculate Conception

During Advent, as we prepare for the birth of Christ at Christmas, we also celebrate one of the great feasts of the Catholic Church. The [Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception](#), Tuesday, December 8th, is not only a celebration of the Blessed Virgin Mary, but a foretaste of our own redemption. It is such an important feast that the Church has declared the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception a [Holy Day of Obligation](#).



The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God, and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Saviour of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin. Because of the way redemption was applied to Mary at the moment of her conception, she not only was protected from contracting original sin, but also personal sin. The Catechism explains: (493) The Fathers of the Eastern tradition call the Mother of God “the All-Holy” (Panagia), and celebrate her as “free from any stain of sin, as though fashioned by the Holy Spirit and formed as a new creature.” By the grace of God, Mary remained free of every personal sin her whole life long.

“Let it be done to me according to your word. . .” To become the mother of the Saviour, Mary “was enriched by God with gifts appropriate to such a role.” The angel Gabriel at the moment of the annunciation salutes her as “full of grace.” In fact, in order for Mary to be able to give the free assent of her faith to the announcement of her vocation, it was necessary that she be wholly borne by God's grace. Mary never sinned.

The Catechism (492) goes on to state: The “splendour of an entirely unique holiness,” by which Mary is “enriched from the first instant of her conception,” comes wholly from Christ: she is “redeemed, in a more exalted fashion, by reason of the merits of her Son.”

The Father blessed Mary more than any other created person “in Christ, with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places,” and chose her “in Christ before the foundation of the world, to be holy and blameless before him in love.” (508) From among the descendants of Eve, God chose the Virgin Mary to be the mother of his Son. “Full of grace,” Mary is “the most excellent fruit of redemption” (SC 103): from the first instant of her conception, she was totally preserved from the stain of original sin, and she remained pure from all personal sin throughout her life. Adam and Eve were both created immaculate--without original sin or its stain. They fell from grace, and through them mankind was bound to sin. Christ and Mary were also conceived immaculate. They remained faithful, and through them mankind was redeemed from sin.

Keeper Of The Inn



Have you ever asked the Holy Spirit to show you who is laying in the manger? He will show you Jesus as "Emmanuel." God wants you to ask Him to increase your love for Jesus. **"Come Lord Jesus and open my heart today."** Christmas should be about God who sent His only Son to save the world. The birth of Jesus is the most magnificent gift that we have been given. Is there any room in the Inn [your heart] for Jesus? Can you make room, or are you burdened with all the distractions and responsibilities of Christmas? This is the enemy's prime time to keep peace out of your heart. Distraction is the enemy's best friend.

Make time to be thankful and prayerful. Is your heart so full of the wrong priorities, that there is no room in your Inn for Jesus? It might be time to clean and purge. The clutter of sadness, worry, hatefulness, prejudice, envious, lustfulness and unforgiveness will make no room for Jesus. You know what sins you are harboring. **Confession is the best way to prepare for Jesus.** It is a great restart. Make your Inn clean. Increase the size of your Inn by doing acts of kindness and charity. The smallest deeds can make a huge impact. Put your trust in Jesus. He wants you to follow Him.



When we think of Jesus in the manger, we also think of Mary and Joseph. What an example of love and obedience. Will you be the Shepherd or the Wise Man who seeks Him to honour, worship and bring Him gifts? **Just stop each day for 15 minutes and meditate on Baby Jesus.** Padre Pio said, **"Stay very close to the crib of the most beautiful child. Have a great love for this heavenly child. Respectful in the familiarity you will gain with Him through prayer, and totally delighted in the joy of feeling the holy aspirations and effects of totally belonging to Him."**

Helping Hands



EMMANUEL: GOD with US

There is a simple story compiled by Alice Gray in a book entitled *More Stories From the Heart*. It explains well the great Mystery of the Incarnation, God with us. "One raw winter night a man heard an irregular thumping sound against the kitchen storm door. He went to a window and watched as tiny shivering sparrows, attracted to the warmth inside, were beating their wings and their bodies against the glass of the door.

Feeling compassion for the helpless creatures, the farmer bundled up and trudged through fresh snow to open the barn for the struggling birds. He turned on the lights, tossed some hay in a corner, and sprinkled a trail of saltine crackers to direct them to the barn. But the sparrows, which had scattered in all directions when he emerged from the house, still hid in the darkness of the night. He tried various tactics [to get them to a place of safety]; circling behind the birds to drive them toward the barn, tossing cracker crumbs in the air toward them, and retreating to his house to see if they'd flutter into the barn on their own. Nothing worked. He, a huge alien creature, had terrified them. The birds could not understand that he really meant them no harm. In fact, he was trying to help them.

He withdrew to his house and watched the doomed sparrows through a window. As he stared, a thought hit him like lightning from a clear blue sky: If only I could become a bird - one of them - just for a moment. Then I wouldn't frighten them so. I could show them the way to warmth and safety.' At the same moment, another thought dawned on him. He realized that he had grasped the whole principle of the Incarnation. A man becoming a bird is nothing compared to God becoming a man. The concept of a sovereign being, as the universe He created, confining Himself to a human body, was, and is too much for some people to believe.

God the Father, at various times in the past and in many different ways, had spoken to our ancestors through the prophets. Man, however, could not fully understand His thoughts and ways, and continued to hide and suffer in the darkness. Man's heart created to be temple of God, was unwilling to let God occupy its center. But, "in our own time, in the last days, God has spoken to us through His Son appointed to inherit everything and through whom He made everything there is" (Hebrews 1: 1-3). God the Father, in His tender loving kindness and goodness, send Him to be one of us, adding humanity to His Deity so we would identify to our Maker, and not be scared to let Him in our hearts. "Man's Maker was made man, that the Ruler of stars might nurse at His mother's breast" (St. Augustine). Emmanuel, God with us, was offering His great gift of Salvation. At first, fear had surprised the shepherds who heard the good news from the Angel that the long-awaited Saviour, Messiah, and Lord was born in the City of David. They believed the message and followed the star that guided them to the Infant Christ lighting their way up to Bethlehem. They found what they had been told. The Eternal Son born one of us, a vulnerable, mortal human babe, with all similar needs as ours, came down from heaven to reveal the Father who is Love and Mercy. He became a Brother, a Pilgrim showing us the way to God. He is the Way. This is the great news of the Incarnation. A Divine plan had long been devised from eternity, and it had only a two-fold message: that we might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing in Him would give man the security of eternal life, through His Name. Jesus, the chosen One, the Messiah, the Light, the Bread, the Truth and Life came to give us life. Now, we can face life's raging storms and find security when we trust in Him. He is our Shelter, our Helper, our Sustainer, our God with us!

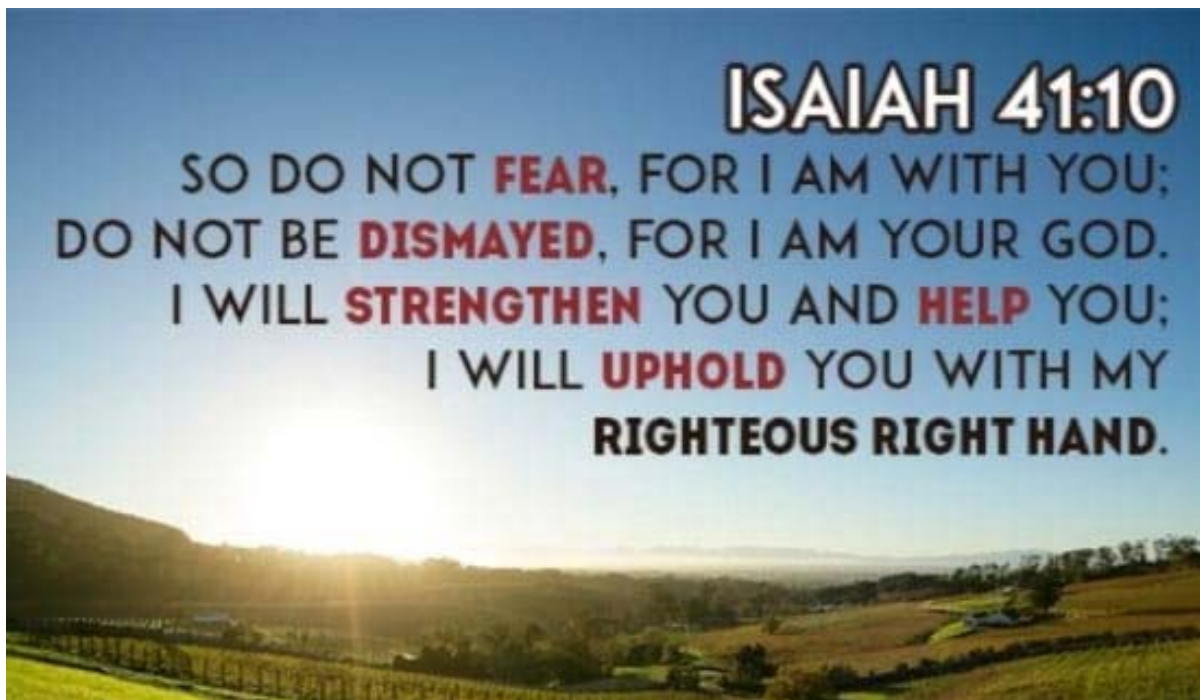
PART TWO: My Witness to the Healing Power of God

God's ways are not our ways. He is Sovereign and in control. My days at home were going to be shortened. On June the 4th, a few times during the wee hours of the night, a strange constant pain similar to a tight elastic band constricting my back had awakened me several times. That morning, I did not mention any of this to John, and proceeded to make the day home a normal day. I was up early and prepared breakfast before Joyce came upstairs to join us. I pretended that all was well until after lunch when I felt strangely wet. I visited the washroom. My abdomen drainage bag was leaking heavily. We needed to go to the Emergency. As we waited for the ambulance, the back pain felt during the night, returned with a vengeance. I called Joyce, and told her that I should have prepared John for the worst. She told me not to listen to the devil's lies. "If this is so," I replied, "then pray on me!" As she put her hands on my back, I felt I had been electrically shocked. A current of heat surprised me so much that I begged her to take her hands off my back but to continue to pray. When the paramedics arrived, I had lost the use of my legs, but what was affecting me the most was John's worried expression. The next moment I was at the hospital and met by my own family doctor, Dr. De Blacam. He happened to be in there at the right time. God's grace and perfect timing, was reminding me that He really works things for our good. Surprisingly, the oncologist on-call was Dr. Lopez. He was called by my physician and ordered a series of test. I was admitted to a private room. The next morning, he came in, grinning from ear to ear. He said that all test results, including the culture of blood, were all normal. I was the healthiest person on the Cancer and Palliative Floor. He palpated my abdomen and expressed his surprise. He could not feel any cancer in there. I became sure of the Lord's intervention. I was also pain free. Moreover, Dr. Lopez was happy that no infection had set in by the disruption of the dislodgment of the drainage tube. He decided to remove it and by precaution, sent a sample of the draining content to the Lab. Results were also normal. I was kept in the hospital a few more days with the order to return again on June 10th. Dr. Lopez wanted to perform an intrathecal: He needed to pierce my spine, extract bone marrow and replace it with chemo. He added that these "suckers", referring to the lymphoma cancer cells, may try to migrate in my brain during the very aggressive treatment he was scheduling to start on June 16th.

The Epoch treatment, a concussion of different types of chemotherapy would be delivered through the pic-line inserted in my right arm, and flow 24 hours a day, for 6 consecutive days a week. When the flow ended a week later, I would be brought to the X-ray Department where, the oncologist would be visually guided to perform the intrathecal as the chemo delivered through the pic-line could not cross the brain barrier. At the end of this, if the exchange had not caused nausea and total weakness, I would be sent home for a week or two to recover. The plan was to administer 8 cycles of Epoch that would last until mid-October. The results from another CAT scan would determine the outcome. However, during my second week of aggressive treatment, I developed a laryngitis that alarmed my oncologist. Early in July, he consulted with Dr. Pearce, a nose, throat and ear oncologist. It was later confirmed by an endoscopy to the throat that one of my vocal cords was paralyzed and that possibly I had developed a secondary throat cancer on its recurrent nerve. I needed

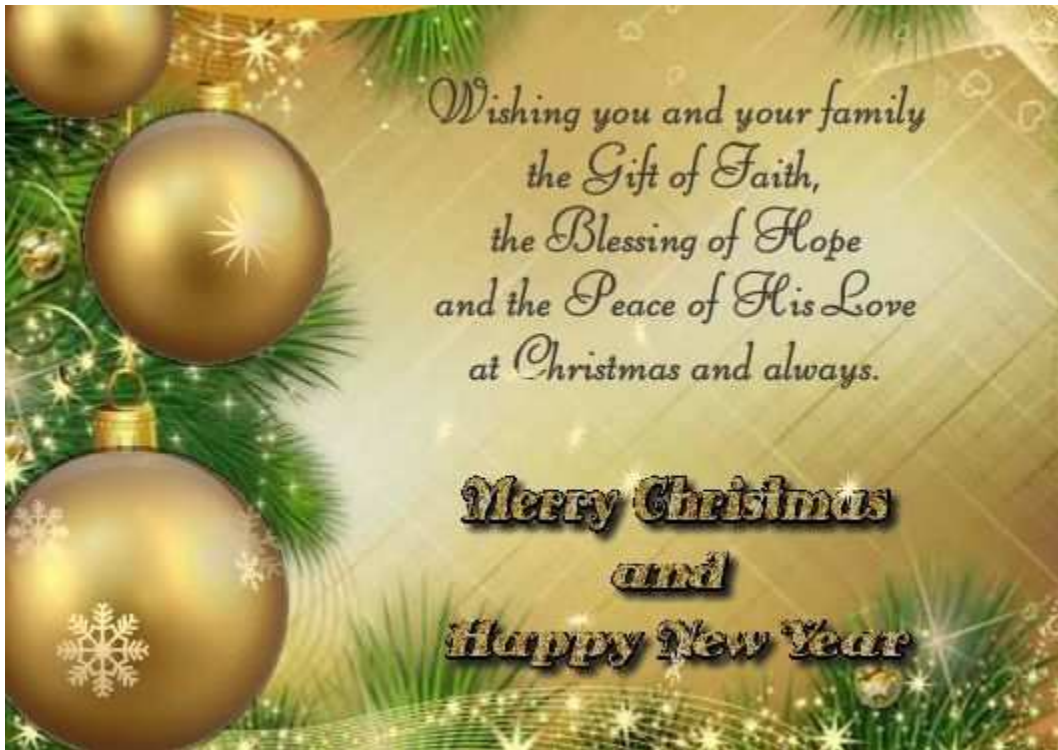

an earlier CAT scan to confirm this. Dr. Lopez convinced Dr. Pearce to ask for a full scan of the throat and abdomen as he could no longer feel the cancer of the lymph nodes in my abdomen. Dr. Pearce's total scan was scheduled for August 16th. On July 17th Dr. Lopez replaced one of the three aggressive chemo to stop further damage to the vocal cord. There is no doubt; the Lord has power to affect everything that comes across our path. Shortly after the August 16th CAT scan, results came. I was given the incredible news that after only three months in the hospital, I was pronounced cancer-free: the cancer wasn't there any longer! Cautiously, Dr. Lopez was only interested in completing, at least six of the full eight scheduled cycles of Epoch. He likened it to an antibiotic. It needed its full dose. The sixth chemo was completed and ended on my late mother's birthday on the 22nd of September, 2016. I attributed my healing to her intervention. My mother was a saintly woman who had been left widowed in 1945 with 12 children and the 13th born 2 weeks after my father's funeral. All her life, she had modelled a deep faith in the Providence of God and been a light to me even to this day. I knew God to be a Faithful and Good God through her. Indeed, faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God. But, apparently, my healing was a medical fact, no one would acknowledge it to be a true miracle or a true intervention of our Faithful Father except for the faith it instilled in my life. I should have died of this lethal cancer, but for some unknown reason, I was allowed to live. My faith was strengthened. No doubt, our God gives us unlimited opportunities to continue "growing in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18). He is a God of second chances. And yes, God plans are beyond our plans. Our times are in His Hands.
