CHAPEL INFORMATION

Our Perpetual Adoration Chapel is back in operation. It has a new procedure. Let us explain. A Tabernacle has been built that will house the Monstrance. It is on the top of the altar that was in the chapel. There are two doors on this Tabernacle. You do not have to book your time in the chapel as before. You can come as often as you wish, every day if you wish. You need a special code to enter the side door - the ramp door. Call for the code.

Once you are in - two things: if no one is already there, open the doors on the Tabernacle and The Lord is present in the Monstrance. If nobody arrives when you wish to leave - close the doors of the Tabernacle and leave through the door you entered. If someone is already there, The Lord will be exposed. You need to know the code to enter the Adoration Chapel. Under no circumstances are you to give this code out. (Only to people who wish to spend time with The Lord)

The chapel is open from 6:00 a.m. until midnight each day. That is why you are free to spend time in the chapel as often as you wish and as long as you wish - each day if so desired.

MEETING INFORMATION

We begin early each Thursday evening as per your request. Two things happen at 6:00 p.m. Firstly, confessions start with the priests present, and secondly, the Rosary and prayers begin. At 6:30 p.m. we are now showing a video titled THE SEARCH. It is a seven week series of excellent quality. After this series we will begin a ten week series called "Metonoia" with Father Dave Pivonka. Each video is approximately 24 minutes in length. This series will be explained in greater detail down the road. You will not want to miss this series. It is a journey of life, one of grace, hope, repentance and transformation.

At 7:00 p.m., we begin a time of praise and worship. We ask you to bring your Bible, reflection time, and at 7:30 p.m. we begin with the Celebration Of Eucharist. This is a great time to come and renew your relationship with Our Lord.

SIN

Did you know that there is such a thing in this world called sin. Our world seems oblivious to this. Look at the condition or state of the world. Is it God centered, or does the evil one seem to have control?

Did you know that people do not feel guilty in committing sin anymore. Sin is not just breaking of a law of Our Lord but it is the breaking of a relationship with Him.

The devil is a very smooth operator. He is cunning, deceptive, full of hatred and jealousy, who will do anything to cause you to sin, to draw you away from Our Lord, to even realize that you have sinned. He does not even make you feel guilty if you sin, he gets you to even feel the denial of guilt, that everything is just peachy, so go ahead and do it again.

You see, the devil does not do bad things to good people. He does good things to good people to stop them from doing better. Oh just a little sin here, a Little sin there, what's the difference. Sin isn't sin anymore, go ahead do it, so he says.

Don't lock up the Holy Spirit in your heart - Pope Francis says:

The Holy Spirit seems to be a "luxury Prisoner" in many Christians' hearts: someone who is welcomed to stay, but not allowed to act or move us forward, said Pope Francis.

We keep The Holy Spirit as a "Luxury prisoner" in our hearts, we do not allow the Spirit to push us forward, to move us. The Spirit does everything, knows everything, reminds us what Jesus said, can explain all about Jesus. In Acts 19:1-8, when the disciples of John at Ephesus, Pope Francis pointed out that the disciples had "not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit."

Likewise, while Christians today have a knowledge of the Holy Spirit as part of the Holy Trinity, they do not know what the Spirit's role is in the Church.

"The Holy Spirit is the one who moves the Church, the one who works in the Church and in our hearts," the Roman Pontiff said.

The Third person of The Trinity is 'The protagonist of the Living Church,' he said, while cautioning against simply reducing the Christian life to a code of "morals and ethics."

The Faith is something more. It is not just an ethical life; it is an encounter with Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit frees us from the orphan-like condition which the spirit of the world wants to put us in.

The Holy Spirit is the one who "moves us to praise God, to pray to The Lord," and who "teaches us to see the Father and call him Father."

There is one thing The Holy Spirit "can't do" the Pope said: "The Holy Spirit cannot make us virtual Christians who are not virtuous." Instead, "The Holy Spirit makes real Christians. The Spirit takes life and prophetically reads the signs of the times pushing us forward."

This is what we must do this week:

THINK OF THE SPIRIT AND TALK TO HIM."

A Happening - Just Begun

On August 4th, back last month we started bringing our Bibles to the prayer meeting. We are trying to learn a little about the Bible each week, and how passages work together. By us coming together each week to learn is a very important.

The first evening we began with Revelation 3:20 and how important this passage is to our every day prayer time. We will refer back to this passage many times over the next few weeks. We then moved on to Galatians 5:22 the 9 fruits of the Holy Spirit. We looked at Joy and how there are three levels of Joy - the body - the head - the heart. We then went on to show how important the Joy of the heart is. We related it to John 16:22 where Our Lord is speaking to His disciples stating - "You are sad now, but I shall see you again, and your hearts will be full of Joy, and that joy no one shall take from you."

When you have the Lord's Joy in your heart no one, "meaning no one," can take it from you. How great is that?

When we begin to be aware of the fruits of the Holy Spirit and when we begin to use them, our life changes for the better. We all should know these fruits off by heart. They are - love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

They say that when we begin using these gifts, a new gift appears. Know what that is? GRATITUDE. Gratitude begins the spreading of the gift of LOVE. Is that not wonderful? Let us look at a definition of the word:

Gratitude is a state of mind that we choose for ourselves. When we look for the good things in each day and give thanks, we allow ourselves to experience the JOY found in the priceless blessing of family and friends.

Gratitude is a gift you can choose each day.

Attitude

We found this story about attitude that leads to gratitude. Since we are a Blue Jays fan - to a degree - thought you might like this baseball story. It happened some time ago, but the story is important, especially as to what is happening today. God Bless!

The job of a baseball manager is to help make ability and capacity meet. Many people with ability never live up to their capacity, while others with the same ability or even less - achieve great heights. What makes the difference? The answer is ambition, hustle, enthusiasm, the desire for perfection, etc. Whatever you call it, it can be summed up in one word, **attitude**.

Branch Rickey, a baseball manager tells the following story to illustrate this point by telling the story of two baseball players, one the great Ty Cobb and the other a man named Walker.

Many years ago, wrote Rickey, when I was managing the St Louis Browns, I lost a game to Detroit in the last half of the eleventh inning in a very unusual manner nothing else like it in the record books anywhere. Detroit came to bat in the last half of the eleventh inning in a tie-score game, two men out and nobody on the bases, when a player named Ty Cobb came to bat.


Cobb got a base on balls and then scored the winning run without another ball being pitched. By sheer adventure and skill he forced two wild throws by St. Louis infielders. His daring at first base, his boldness and skillful turn at second, his characteristic slide ten feet

before he reached third, his quick coordination following the slide - all brought about four "breaks" in his favour. He made what amounted to a home run out of a base on balls.

In the very same game, there was a player on my team by the name of Walker, a man who had all the physical qualities to be a great player. During a game in Beaumont, Texas the following spring, Walker hit what should have been a home run - and was thrown out at third. Walker's slow start to first base, as he watched his hard line drive fall between the left and center fielders, cost him 20 feet. Next, he lost another 30 feet making too wide a turn around first toward second base. Then, seeing the elusive ball on its way to the Texas prairies, he slowed to a jog trot. This easily cost him still another 50 feet, and he was now 100 feet behind schedule.

The centre fielder's strong arm brought the throw toward third, and Walker seeing that a play could be made on him, put on a great burst of speed. He was tagged out at third base. In discussing the play later, everyone agreed that if he had not made any one of the four mistakes he would have scored a home run.

What is the difference between Cobb and Walker? They were about the same age, weight, height, and running speed. Walker had a stronger arm than Cobb and more power at the bat. Yet one rose to unparalleled fame; the other obscurity. Cobb wanted to do something so much that nothing else mattered. Walker punched the clock.



A Little Boy's Explanation Of God

The Power of The Rosary

On August 4th the format of our prayer meeting changed. As mentioned earlier in this newsletter, we begin at 6:00 p.m. with The Rosary. This is a very powerful prayer. Even the devil is fearful of this prayer. Let us explain with a story. One day as a friend of mine started to say the rosary, he heard in his heart the following: "Every Hail Mary is a blow to heart of the devil. If Christians only knew how powerful the Rosary is, it would be my (devil) end."

The secret that makes this prayer so effective is that the Rosary is both prayer and meditation. It is addressed to The Father, The Blessed Virgin and to The Holy Trinity, and is a meditation centered on Christ.

All of us fall into a routine and it is difficult sometimes to break this routine. We are asking you to begin a new routine every Thursday evening. Would you consider putting The Lord **first** on Thursday evenings by coming early, before 6:00 p.m. so you would be present for confession, if needed, and for the Rosary?

Back a few years ago, The Lord spoke to us asking if we would put Him **first** in our life. Possibly this could be the start of you doing just that, putting The Lord first on Thursday evenings.

God prepared Mary with special care and grace. He wants to do the same with us. Although the Angel Gabriel will not come to us as he did for Mary, but he is always challenging us to draw closer to Our Lord. Even before her birth, God made her holy. He wants us to also grow in holiness.

Now as we pray the Rosary, or even just recite one Hail Mary, we receive many, many graces. Anyone who goes to Mary and prays the Rosary cannot be touched by satan. It is of great wonder that anyone who prays the Rosary from the heart is blessed and protected and powerful in their prayers for others. Let us begin by saying this prayer together each Thursday evening. Thank you for making this possible.

IMPORTANCE OF PRAYER

Prayer is the breathing of the soul. It is our spiritual umbilical cord channeling God's nourishment and oxygen to us. This is how St. John Chrysostom describes prayer. He continued. "A fish taken out of water cannot live. In a very short time it dies. Neither can the soul of men and women exist without prayer, it will gradually grow indifferent. It will die. Let us be convinced that not to pray and to lose the life of the soul, that is, the Grace of God, is one and the same thing."

St Teresa of Avila had this to say about prayer and the consequences of indifference towards it: "Souls that have no habit of prayer are like a lame and paralytic body, which, though it has hands and feet, cannot use them. Therefore: to abandon prayer is to me the same thing as to lose the straight road; for prayer is the gate through which all the graces

of God come to us. When the gate is closed, how can we receive any graces?

Prayer is essential to the Christian life. It is very important in our lives so we can be united to Him and bear much fruit.

The Holy Spirit tells us what we ought to pray for and how to pray and how to enter into a deeper and meaningful relationship with the Three Persons of the Trinity. Our own reason and intuition limit our prayers. With The Holy Spirit's help, we become inspired by Heaven. Moreover, we are His Temples. He dwells in us and thus we can pray with His power and His energy.

God is restoring us as we begin a new relationship with Him in prayer. Let us grow together as we begin to pray a little more each day. Prayer is a very special gift when used, muses great results. So let us grow. Agreed? Agree

The Duty of the Moment

We are so busy these days. It's as if we are on a merry-go-round or roller coaster. Faster, faster, faster — that's us. We don't know if we're going forward, backward or which way. So here we are, living in a world that goes on all around us — more selfish, more greedy than before. Faster, faster, faster it goes. But Christ said, "I have come to serve" (Matthew 20:28), and so should we. Christ said, "Pray always." We should also. But how? How do we live in this world today? How do we serve? Well, the answer that I've seen, after 50 years of this lay apostolate, is to do the duty of the moment.

The duty of the moment is what you should be doing at any given time, in whatever place God has put you. If you have a child, your duty of the moment may be to change a dirty diaper. So you do it. But you don't just change that diaper, you change it to the best of your ability, with great love for both God and the child. Do you do it that way? You can see Christ in that child.

Or your duty of the moment may be to scrub your floors. Do you scrub your floors well? With great love for God? If not, do so. If you see to it that your house is well-swept, your food is on the table, and there is peace during meals, then there is a slow order that is established, and the immense tranquility of God's order falls upon you and your family, all of you together.

Your doing the duty of the moment, your living the nitty-gritty, daily routine of ordinary life, can uncover the face of Christ in the marketplace. Christ can come into the place where you work or play or eat. He will come into your home or into a restaurant. He will come into a school or a company cafeteria or a subway or wherever.

Let me give you an example. When I first came to North America, I had to support my sick husband and our baby, so I had a job as a waitress and that was my duty of the moment.

Well, there is a way of being a waitress and there is a way of being a waitress. Let me explain. It so happened that I was working at a restaurant near Wall Street in New York City

and every day a very fat gentleman would come in and eat pies. He would eat loads of pies, half pies. So, one day, very quietly, I said to him, "You must love God very much, dear sir." Of course, he looked at me rather strangely. Can you imagine anyone saying something like that? He said, "What do you mean?" I said, "Well, you're eating so much of this pie, it will get you back to him fast — before you know it." He looked at me and said, "What you're trying to tell me is that I'm committing suicide through my fork." I said, "Well, I wasn't going to put it that bluntly." I was about three inches away from him, and he looked at me and said, "Lady, you've got something there." And he gave me a five dollar tip. The next day he came in and said, "OK, what do I eat?" I said, "A salad."

So, you see, there is a way to be a waitress and there is a way to be a waitress. He said, "You show very much concern, not only to me, but to that gentleman over there too. He's so thin and you're always feeding him more." I said, "Well, I hope you do not object to my bringing religion into this situation. I believe in God and I believe that God said, 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' So you're fat; I want to make you thin. He is thin; I want to make him fat. That, I think, is loving each other." He said, "Gee whiz. I must tell that to my wife." I didn't preach, really. I didn't say I was Catholic or Protestant. I just said, "You're welcome."

So this is what I mean. You, as a Christian, as a follower of Christ, do your duty of the moment. Whatever your duty is, you do it with great love. And as you do, the image of Christ, the icon of Christ, will be shown to people wherever you are — in your home, in your place of work outside the home, in your school, in the neighbourhood where you live, in your church, in the grocery store, wherever you happen to be.

Now, it's fine to say "Praise the Lord" and so forth, but remember that Christ said, "It's not the one who says 'Lord, Lord' who is going to heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father" (Matthew 7:21). What's the will of the Father? It's so simple. It's the duty of the moment.

Christ The King

Jesus Christ is both Lord and King as the Scriptures testify: "They will make war on the Lamb, and the Lamb will conquer them, for he is Lord of lords and King of kings, and those with him are called chosen and faithful" (Revelation 17:14) and "On his robe and on his thigh he has a name inscribed, 'King of kings and Lord of lords'" (Revelation 19:16).

We Christian believers acclaim Jesus as Lord, our Lord and our Master, the One to whom we give allegiance. But what does this mean in practical ways? How fully is He Lord in our lives? We may have received Him as our personal Saviour, however we must also receive Him as King and Lord of our lives, the One to whom we are responsible, the One whom we obey, the One we go to for teaching, direction, appointment, anointing and empowerment. It is His approval that we are to seek, for it is to Him that we are ultimately responsible.

To us in Canada, kingship is pretty much an unknown concept. Yes, Queen Elizabeth is our queen but for all intents and purposes that does not affect us in our daily lives. In the olden days of kingship, the king had absolute authority and power, even the power of letting a person live or having him put to death. Many ruled as tyrants, but that is not the kind of king we have in Jesus. Yes, He has been given all authority and power in heaven and on earth. Yet He has not chosen to impose His will upon us. He is looking for a freely-chosen relationship with every human being.

Love forced is not love at all. The devil uses fear and pressure against us, but Jesus stands with arms wide open calling us to Himself. As His people, we have the choice of accepting or rejecting Him and His kingship. Jesus came that the kingdom of heaven be extended to all the earth and that you and I would be His representatives, His ambassadors on earth. As His representatives we are to share in His authority and power, not for our own purposes but for His purpose of "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." And, "I have come not to do my will but the will of the One who sent me." That is why each person is on earth. No, not everyone lives according to that purpose, but that is His calling to every person and He equips everyone who says "yes" to Him.

When we are on kingdom business He looks after us. I noticed some years ago that when I was on my own business and took longer than expected, I would get a parking ticket. When I was on His business I wouldn't get a ticket. When I am on His business or have invited Him into mine, convenient parking spots are available. Not so when I go on my own and forget to invite Him along. It is great working with the King! And you know what? He enjoys working with us.

When Mary and Joseph found Jesus in the temple, as we read in Luke 2:49, He said to them, "Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" Or, in some translations, "Did you not know that I must be about my Father's business?" Whose business are you about? Your heavenly Father's business or your own that you are trying to manage without His involvement? Don't make the mistake of trying to make it on your own. Believe me, it doesn't work. I have tried to go it on my own and found that it is far too difficult and far too stressful to leave Him out of even the simplest aspects of our lives. Turn to Jesus; He's the one who can meet your every need; He's the one who can equip you to be and to do all you are called to do in bringing about the kingdom of God upon the earth.

There is no one else like you; He needs you and the particular set of talents, gifts and graces He has given you. Child of God, ambassador of the Most High, step confidently into the destiny He has prepared for you before the foundation of the world. Let Him guide you by His Spirit and His Word. Let Him anoint you with the Holy Spirit, just as He was anointed and empowered. Let him rule and reign not only in you but, through you.
